1st Quarter 2002

1. Passenger Traffic

1.1 Total Passenger Traffic

During the first quarter of 2002, a total of 235,605 arrivals were registered against 248,325 departures, i.e. an excess of 12,720 departures over arrivals. Compared to the corresponding period of year 2001, these figures represent increases of 7.6% and 6.2% in arrivals and departures respectively. Movements by sea accounted for 8.3% of both arrivals and departures. Further details on monthly trends are given in Table 1.

1.2 Excursionists

Total arrivals by air included 1,985 "excursionists", i.e. visitors arriving and leaving on the same day. Of these excursionists, 752 (37.9%) came from Reunion Island while 394 (19.8%) came from France. Total arrivals by sea included 14,243 "cruise excursionists" (8,118 passengers and 6,125 crews) aboard 17 cruise ships, which visited our port during the first three months of 2002.

1.3 Mauritian Residents

The number of Mauritian residents travelling abroad during the first quarter of 2002 went down by 2.6% to stand at 36,788 against 37,757 for the corresponding period of the preceding year. The following changes were observed in the number of Mauritians visiting the major destinations: Hong Kong (+56.5%), Australia (+28.7%), Republic of South Africa (+24.5%), United Kingdom (+13.3%), France (+3.1%), Singapore (-4.3%), Reunion Island (-10.5%), India (-15.7%), Saudi Arabia (-28.6%) and Malagasy Republic (-50.3%). Table 2 shows a more detailed distribution of countries visited.

1.4 Tourist Arrivals

During the first quarter of 2002, tourist arrivals numbered 181,659, which is 6.5% higher than the figure of 170,530 attained in the same period of 2001. Further details on tourist arrivals are given in Tables 3 to 6.

Around 93% of the tourists came mainly for holidays while 3% were on business/conference trips, and another 3% were in transit (Table 4).

Arrivals from Europe, which accounts for 69.8% of total tourist arrivals, went up by 7.7% to 126,836 during the first quarter of 2002 against 117,731 in the same quarter of 2001. Arrivals from France, our leading market representing 33% of total tourist arrivals and 47% of the European market, rose by 6.5% and attained 59,966 at the end of March 2002. Growths were also noted in arrivals from the other major generating countries, namely Germany (+19.2%) and United Kingdom (+18%). On the other hand, arrivals from Italy registered a drop of 12.7%. Trends among the other countries were as follows: Spain (+48.9%), Austria (+13.1%), Netherlands (-3.4%), Belgium (-6.0%), Switzerland (-7.1%) and Sweden (-17.2%).

For the first quarter of 2002, arrivals from Africa, with a share of 24.0% of total tourist arrivals, went up by 7.4% to 43,651. Arrivals from Reunion Island, the major market of the region, increased by 9.9% while those from Republic of South Africa dropped by 3.7%. Changes in arrivals from other African countries were as follows: Zimbabwe(+70.2%), Kenya (+44.3%), Seychelles (+40.5%), Malagasy Republic(-9.7%) and Comoros (-27.8%).

Tourist arrivals from the Asian market regressed by 3.4% for the reference period and constituted 4.2% of total tourist arrivals. Arrivals from India, our major source on this continent, went down by 2.4% to reach 3,460. The performance of other Asian countries was as follows: Japan (+48.0%), People's Republic of China (+4.1%), Hong Kong (-2.3%), Singapore (-6.3%) and Malaysia (-31.6%).

Arrivals from Oceania fell by 8.9% due largely to a decline of 7.8% in arrivals from Australia.

Arrivals from the continent of America went down by 24.0%, being the result of the net effect of decreases of 12.9% and 56% from Canada and countries classified in "other American" respectively, coupled with a growth of 0.3% from U.S.A.

2. Tourist Nights

Total tourist nights spent in the country during the first quarter of 2002 is estimated at 1.8 million, representing an increase of 6.4% over the same period of 2001.

3. Hotel Statistics

At the end of March 2002, there was a total of 94 registered hotels in operation. The total room capacity for these registered hotels was 8,770 with 17,846 bed places (Table 7). The room occupancy rate for all hotels for the first three months of 2002 averaged 72% while the bed occupancy rate was 64% (Table 8).

"Large" hotels, i.e. well-established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms, numbered 36 (38.3% of all registered hotels). These "Large" hotels had a room capacity of 6,424 with 12,963 bedplaces, representing 73.2% of total room capacity and 72.6% of total bedplaces. The average room occupancy rate for these hotels for the first quarter of 2002 was of the order of 77% while bed occupancy rate averaged 69% (Table 8).

4. Gross Tourism Receipts

Data from the Bank of Mauritius indicate that gross tourism receipts for the first quarter of 2002 were of the order of Rs 5,005 million, i.e. an increase of 9.2% compared to Rs 4,584 million for the same period of 2001. The average receipts per tourist during that period was Rs 27,552 against Rs 26,880 in 2001(Table 6).

5. Employment

According to the Survey of Employment and Earnings, direct employment in travel and tourism establishments employing 10 persons or more stood at 19,944 at the end of March 2001, that is 12.0% higher than the previous year. Of this number, 75.3% or 15,023 were engaged in hotels (Table 9).

6. Forecast Year 2002

The World Tourism Organisation (WTO) expects continued recovery in the world tourism industry, with pre-crisis levels being attained by the third or fourth quarter of 2002. In the light of the number of tourist arrivals registered in the first quarter of 2002, in particular in March, total tourist arrivals for the year 2002 are now expected to reach 695,000, that is around 5% higher than the preceding year.

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Explanatory Notes

1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying for more than 24 hours but less than a year, who is not involved in any gainful occupation in the country during his/her stay.

2. Transit

A transit passenger is one who stops over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

Type I: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the harbour.

Type II: Passengers who do leave the airport or harbour and stay in the country for more than 24 hours but only for flight connection purposes.Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

Excursionists are non-resident visitors, other than those who do not leave the airport, who stay in the country for less than 24 hours. They also include passengers as well as crews of *cruise ships*.

4. Tourist Nights

"Tourist nights" means the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists, as defined above, during the period under review.

5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

6. CIS

CIS denotes the Commonwealth of Independent States, which consists of the states of the former Soviet Union.






