The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises

1st Quarter 2002

Introduction

This issue of the "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the findings of the Quarterly Survey of Employment carried out at the end of March 2002. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises. The latter are "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving the application of high technology.

Provisional figures on EPZ imports and exports for the first quarter 2002 as well as revised figures for the previous years are also given. Table 1.1 shows the main economic indicators for the EPZ sector for the period 1991 to 2001.

2. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

2.1 Number of enterprises

During the 1st quarter of 2002, 10 enterprises closed down and two new ones started operation, bringing the total number of EPZ enterprises at the end of the quarter to 514. The number of enterprises with fewer than 10 workers numbered 134 and represented nearly 26% of the total number of enterprises and less than 1% of the workforce.

The number of enterprises in the "Wearing apparel" group, the most important one in the EPZ, stood at 234 compared to 239 at the end of December 2001 and 243 at the end of March 2001. The "Flowers" group was operating with 39 enterprises at the end of March 2002. Other details by product group are given in Table 1.2.

2.2 Employment evolution, 1st quarter 2002

At the end of March 2002, employment in the EPZ stood at 86,865, a decline of 742 compared to the previous quarter. The number of female employees fell by 634, from 58,162 to 57,528 and male employment decreased by 108, from 29,445 to 29,337. The ratio of male to female employment in the EPZ workforce remained at approximately 1 to 2.

During the 1st quarter of 2002, a total of 3,710 jobs were created, of which 2,343 through expansion in 26 existing enterprises. The number of jobs created by the two new enterprises was 1,367. On the other hand, 4,452 jobs were lost: 2,054 through reduction in 22 existing enterprises and 2,398 following the closure of 10 enterprises (Table 1.5).

Compared to the previous quarter, employment in the "Wearing apparel" product group declined by 759 during the first quarter, bringing the number of employees to 71,386. Within the group, employment in "Other garments" decreased by 542 and in "Pullovers" by 217. Details of other changes in employment by product group are shown in Table 1.7.

The number of foreign workers in the EPZ, which stood at 15,668 at the beginning of the quarter, rose by 93 to reach 15,761 at the end of March 2002. Female employment rose by 28 while among males, there was an increase of 65. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex. It will be noted that the majority (92%) of foreign workers in the EPZ were employed in the "Wearing apparel" sector.

2.3 Employment evolution, March 2001- March 2002

Compared to March 2001, the number of EPZ enterprises fell by 13 while employment went down by 6,353.

In the group "Wearing apparel", employment decreased by 5,983, from 77,369 to 71,386. Within this group, employment in "Other garments" fell by 5,013 while a decline of 970 was registered in "Pullovers". On the other hand, employment increased by 160 in the group "Jewellery and related articles". Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

2.4 Imports and exports

Provisional figures for EPZ exports indicated a drop of 5.7% from Rs 7,354 million in the first quarter of 2001 to Rs 6,935 in the first quarter of 2002.

EPZ Imports for the 1st quarter of 2002 reached Rs 3,844 million, which is the same level as that registered in the corresponding period of 2001. However, the import bill for raw materials went up by 1.1% while imports of machinery and equipment went down by 13.4%.

Net exports, i.e., exports minus imports, amounted to Rs 3,091 million, which is 45% of total exports (Table 1.9).

Exports of "Manufactured articles of apparel and clothing", which represents nearly 78% of EPZ exports, went down by 5.5% from Rs 5,692 million in the first quarter of 2001 to Rs 5,380 million in 2002. An increase of 47.3% was noted in the exports of "Fish and fish preparations", from Rs 298 million to Rs 439 million.

Exports to the European Union (EU) countries (which accounted for 64% of total exports for the quarter) dropped by 4.4% from Rs 4,607 million in the first quarter of 2001 to Rs 4,412 million in the same period of 2002. Within the EU, exports to France dropped by 5.5% (from Rs 1,588 million to Rs 1,501 million) while those to United Kingdom increased by 11.4% (from Rs 1,519 million to Rs 1,692 million). Exports to USA, which accounted for

29% of total exports for the quarter, went up by 5.2% (from Rs 1,943 million to Rs 2,044 million).

3. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

3.1 Number of enterprises

During the 1st quarter of 2002, four new enterprises started operation while one closed down, bringing the total number of PSE's to 248. Among these, 89 were operating with 10 or more workers. Further details of these enterprises are given in Table 2.1. The highest number of enterprises was in "Other support services" (61) followed by "Light engineering" (41) and "Informatics" (39).

3.2 Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of March 2002 was 3,103 (2,270 males and 833 females), a shortfall of 118 over the previous quarter's figure of 3,221 (2,385 males and 836 females) (Table 2.3).

During the 1st quarter of 2002, 167 jobs were created: 20 by the four new enterprises and 147 following expansion in 42 existing enterprises. On the other hand, 285 jobs were lost due to reduction of 281 in existing enterprises and four following the closure of one enterprise (Table 2.4) The number of expatriates employed as at the end of the 1st quarter 2002 stood at 167 (156 males and 11 females).
