

## **External Trade – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2002**

### **Introduction**

This issue of the Social and Economic Indicators presents external trade statistics for the first quarter of 2002 and for the years 2000 and 2001. While figures for 2000 are final, those for 2001 and 2002 are subject to revision in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for. However, it was not possible before the first quarter of 2002 to include Freeport transactions in our general trade statistics because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority. Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it possible to integrate data of the Freeport zone with those of Customs.

Hence, as mentioned in the last two Economic and Social Indicators on External Trade, published in December 2001 and March 2002, the data for the first quarter of 2002 include imports and exports of the Mauritius Freeport. Thus, the data for the first quarter of 2002 presented in this Indicator are not comparable with those for the previous periods. However, a set of detailed tables on trade statistics for the first quarter of 2002, excluding Freeport, is being worked out and will be made available on request. It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius because it is not possible to distinguish between domestic exports and re-exports of freeport licensees. It is estimated that currently some 10% of freeport exports are sourced locally.

Another change in this issue concerns the grouping of countries. With the re-organisation and redefinition of trade tariff, countries are no longer grouped under “Preferential” and “Non-preferential”. They have now been grouped by continents.

Detailed statistical tables on imports and exports of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) are published in the indicator on "EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises", which appears in this same issue.

### **1. Total value of trade and trade balance**

Total international trade for the first quarter of 2002 was valued at Rs 25,038 million, a figure which is 2.3% lower than that of the corresponding quarter of 2001.

During the first quarter of 2002, total exports reached Rs 11,556 million compared to total imports of Rs 13,482 million, thus resulting in a trade deficit of Rs 1,926 million.



Based on the trends for previous years, total exports for the year 2002 are expected to be of the order of Rs 56,500 million, as against Rs 66,900 million for imports which will include aircraft worth Rs 500 million. The trade deficit will be around Rs 10,400 million.

## **2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)**

During the first quarter of 2002, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, decreased by four percentage points to 89, from 93 in the fourth quarter of 2001 (Table 2). This movement was due mainly to a decrease of 3.4% in export prices while import prices increased by 0.8%. It should be noted that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 3 and 4.

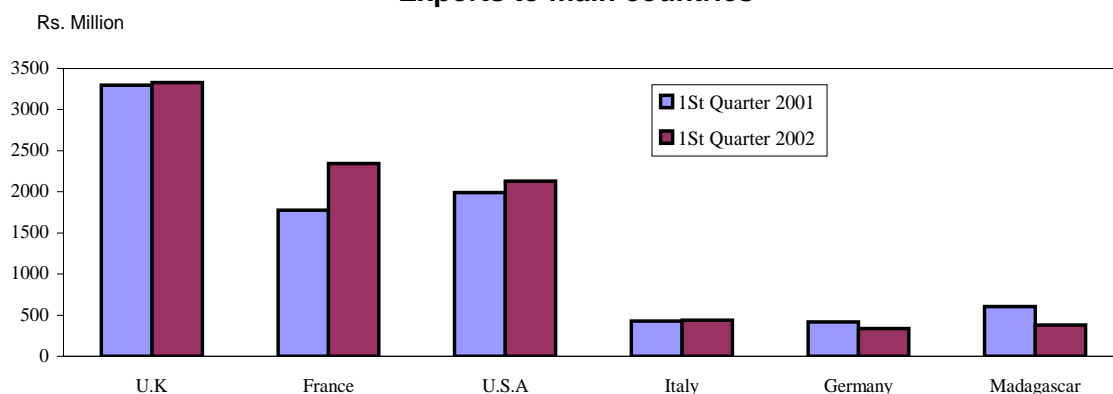
## **3. Exports**

Total export proceeds for the first quarter of 2002, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs 11,556 million, showing a decrease of 2.7% over the corresponding quarter of 2001.

Total domestic exports, which represented about 78% of total exports, decreased by 6% in nominal terms, compared to first quarter 2001. This change in value was accompanied by a 7% increase in price, thus resulting in a 12% decrease in volume.

Analysis by country of destination shows that our main buyers, i.e the European countries, purchased some 65% of our exports for Rs 7,177 million. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs 3,327 million, or 30% of total exports, followed by France with Rs 2,342 million (21%). The other major markets were U.S.A (19%), Italy (4%), Germany (3%) and Malagasy Republic (3%). Table 7 shows further details.

## 4. Imports

Total imports for the first quarter of 2002 reached Rs 13,482 million, showing a decrease of 1.9% over the figure registered during the corresponding period of 2001. Overall import prices are estimated to have increased by around 4% while import volume fell by 6%.

Further details by section and commodity are given in tables 8 and 9.

### Imports from main countries

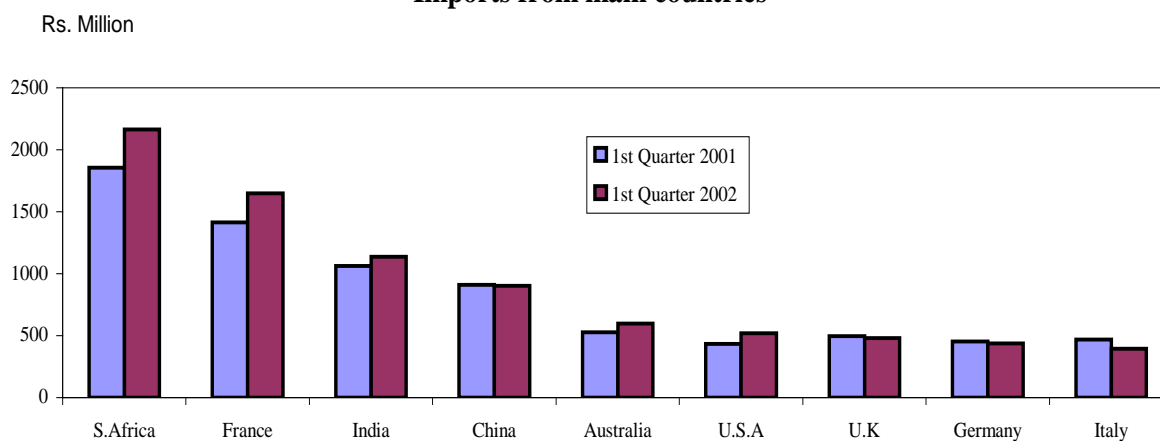


Table 10 shows imports by country of origin. During the first quarter of 2002, imports from Asia totalled Rs 4,910 million, representing 36% of total imports for that period. Our main supplier countries were the Republic of South Africa (16%), France (12%), India (8%), China (7%), U.S.A (4%), United Kingdom (4%), Australia (4%), Germany (3%), Italy (3%) and Japan (3%).

## 5. Trade with Regional Organisations

Total exports to African, Carribean and Pacific (ACP) States during the first quarter of 2002 amounted to Rs 648 million, while imports stood at Rs 749 million (Table 11).

During the first quarter of 2002, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs 605 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs 636 million, resulting in an unfavourable balance of Rs 31 million for Mauritius. This is mainly due to a decrease of about 37% in exports to Malagasy Republic compared to the corresponding quarter of last year.

Trade with SADC countries for the first quarter showed a deficit of Rs 2,338 million, resulting from imports to a value of Rs 2,632 million and exports amounting to Rs 294 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (82%). Our main buyers were Republic of South Africa (32%), Seychelles (28%), Zimbabwe (23%), and Mozambique (8%).

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# External Trade

## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

#### 4. **Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
