

## External Trade – 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2002

### Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents external trade statistics for the third quarter of 2002 and for the years 2000 and 2001. While figures for 2000 and 2001 are final, those for 2002 are subject to revision in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for. However, it was not possible before January 2002 to include Freeport transactions in our external trade statistics because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority. Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it possible to integrate data of the Freeport zone with those of Customs.

Hence, as from 2002, data on imports and exports include transactions through the Mauritius Freeport. Thus, the data for 2002 presented in this Indicator are not comparable with those for the previous periods. It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius because it is not possible to distinguish between domestic exports and re-exports of freeport licensees. It is estimated that currently some 30% of freeport exports are sourced locally.

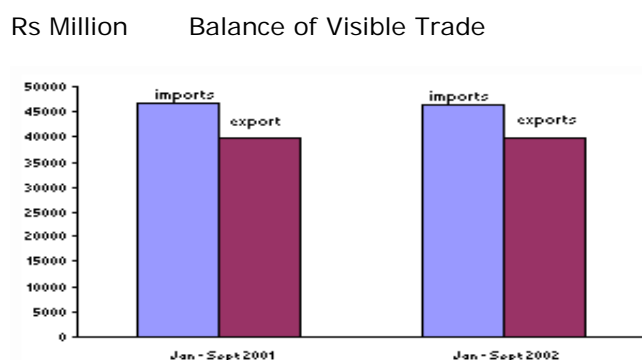
Another change as from 2002 concerns the grouping of countries. With the re-organisation and redefinition of trade tariff, countries are no longer grouped under "Preferential" and "Non-preferential". They have now been grouped by continent.

Detailed statistical tables on imports and exports of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) are published in the indicator on "EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises", which appears in this same issue.

### 1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the third quarter of 2002 was valued at Rs 31,740 million, a figure which is 7.9% higher than that of the previous quarter and 3.8% lower than that of the corresponding quarter of 2001.

During the third quarter of 2002, total exports reached Rs 15,160 million compared to total imports of Rs 16,580 million, thus resulting in a trade deficit of Rs 1,420 million.



Based on the trends for previous years, total exports for the year 2002 are expected to be of the order of Rs 57,800 million, as against Rs 66,600 million for imports. The trade deficit will therefore amount to Rs 8,800 million.

### 2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)

During the third quarter of 2002, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, increased by three percentage points to 96, from 93 in the second quarter of 2002 (Table 2). This favourable movement was due mainly to an increase of 4.1% in export prices while import prices increased by 0.8%. It should be borne in mind that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 3 and 4.

### 3. Exports

Total export proceeds for the third quarter of 2002, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs 15,160 million, showing a decrease of Rs 386 million (or 2.5%) over the figure of Rs 15,546 million registered in the corresponding quarter of 2001.

Domestic exports, which represent about 83% of total exports, increased from Rs 12,405 million to Rs 12,613 million (1.7%) during these two periods.

Total exports for the first nine months of 2002 reached Rs 39,838 million, showing an increase of 0.3% over the figure of Rs 39,702 million noted for the corresponding period of 2001.

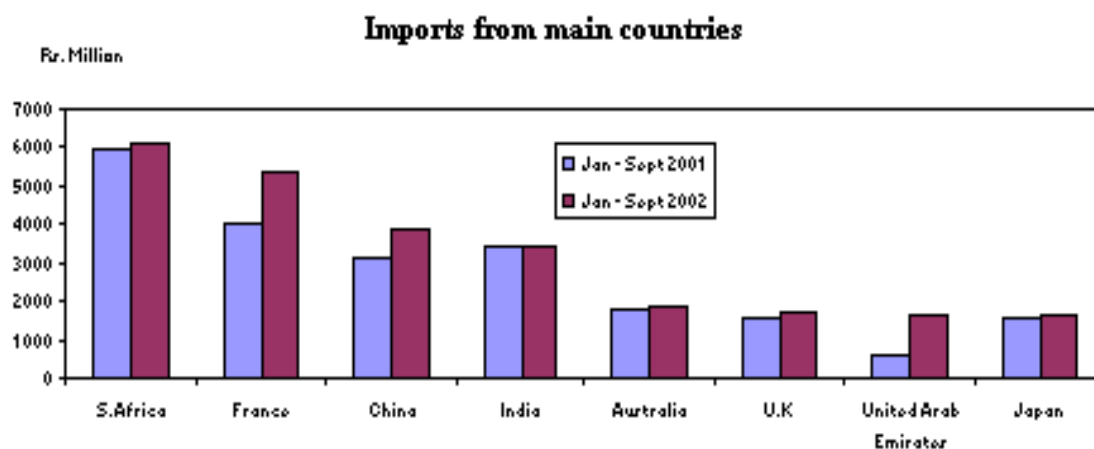
Analysis by country of destination shows that European countries purchased some 65% of our exports for Rs 24,686 million, representing an increase of about 12% over the first nine months of 2001. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs 11,280 million, or 30% of total exports, followed by France with Rs 7,628 million (20%). The other major markets were U.S.A (19%), Italy (4%), Malagasy Republic (3%) and Germany (3%). Table 7 shows further details.



### 4. Imports

Total imports for the third quarter of 2002 reached Rs 16,580 million, showing an increase of 1.7% over the second quarter of 2002 and a decrease of 4.9% over the third quarter of 2001.

Total imports for the first nine months of 2002, which totalled Rs 46,357 million, was 1.0% lower than the value of Rs 46,842 million registered for the corresponding period of last year.



Further details by section and commodity are given in tables 8 and 9.

Table 10 shows imports by country of origin. During the period January -September 2002, imports from Asia totalled Rs 19,400 million, representing around 42% of total imports for that period, and those from Europe, Rs 13,730 million (30%).

On a countrywise basis, our main suppliers were the Republic of South Africa (13%), France (12%), China (8%), India (7%), Australia (4%), United Kingdom (4%), United Arab Emirates (4%) and Japan (4%).

## 5. Trade with Regional Organisations

### ACP States

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States during the third quarter of 2002 amounted to Rs 1,023 million showing an increase of 50% over the previous quarter. Total imports, however, fell by 16% when compared to the previous quarter, i.e, from Rs 714 million to Rs 596 million.

During the first nine months of 2002, total exports to these countries were valued at Rs 2,352 million compared to Rs 2,059 million worth of imports (Table 11).

### COMESA States

During the third quarter of 2002, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs 928 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs 517 million, resulting in a balance of Rs 411 million in favour of Mauritius. Compared to the second quarter of 2002, exports went up by 58% and imports fell by 13%.

For the first nine months of 2002, total exports to COMESA countries amounted to Rs 2,119 million and imports Rs 1,746 million. The main buyer was Malagasy Republic with a share of 61% of exports, while the main supplier was Seychelles with a share of 41% of imports.

### SADC States

Trade with SADC countries for the third quarter of 2002 showed a deficit of Rs 1,816 million, resulting from imports to a value of Rs 2,215 million and exports amounting to Rs 399 million.

For the first nine months of 2002, Mauritius imported Rs 7,346 million worth of goods from SADC countries while exports were of the order of Rs 1,049 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (83%). Our main buyers were Republic of South Africa (38%), Seychelles (27%), Zimbabwe (17%) and Tanzania (7%).

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## External Trade

### Notes

#### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses

- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports

from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

## (2) **Valuation**

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

## (3) **Classification**

### (i) **Commodity Code**

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS 2002). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

## 4. **Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
