AGRICULTURAL AND FISH PRODUCTION (January - June 2003)

Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicator presents data on agricultural and fish production for the Island of Mauritius during the first six months of 2003, as well as revised figures for year 2002. Table 1 shows area harvested and production in respect of the main agricultural crops while Table 2 shows production of the main agro-industrial products.

It is to be noted that crop production during the first semester of 2003 was adversely affected, following the passage of cyclones Gerry in February and Manou in May and also by excessive rainfall during the period under review.

2. Sugar cane

No sugar cane was harvested during the period January to June 2003, as was the case in the corresponding period of 2002.

The Mauritius Chamber of Agriculture has revised its forecast for the 2003 crop to 540,000 tonnes of sugar, that is 3.7% higher than the 520,887 tonnes obtained during the 2002 crop.

3. Tea

At the end of June 2003, area under tea plantation stood at 680 hectares, representing an increase of 3.0% over the corresponding period of 2002.

Production of green tea leaves during the first semester of 2003 increased by 10.1%: 4,254 tonnes as compared to 3,863 tonnes for the same period of 2002. A breakdown of production by type of producer is given in Table 4.

Production of black tea went up by 11.9%, from 767 tonnes in the first semester of 2002 to 858 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2003.

4. Tobacco

An area of 156 hectares under tobacco cultivation was harvested during the first semester of 2003 compared to 100 hectares for the corresponding period of 2002, representing a rise of 56.0%. The production of tobacco leaves went up accordingly by 68.1% from 166 tonnes to 279 tonnes.

5. Foodcrops

Data on foodcrops production are supplied by the Agricultural Research and Extension Unit (AREU). These figures are thereafter adjusted to take into account backyard production of banana, eddoes, manioc and sweet potato.

Area harvested registered a decrease of 8.5% from 3,231 hectares in January-June 2002 to 2,957 hectares in the corresponding period of 2003, while production dropped by 5.8% from 38,063 tonnes to 35,869 tonnes.

6. Livestock

During the period January-June 2003, the production of beef from live cattle amounted to 961 tonnes, which is 0.9% higher than the figure of 952 tonnes registered in the corresponding period of 2002. Beef production from the slaughter of imported cattle decreased slightly by 0.2%, from 841 tonnes to 839 tonnes, while local beef production (including live cattle from Rodrigues) increased by 9.9%, from 111 tonnes to 122 tonnes.

Local production accounted for only 12.7% of total beef production.

The production of goat meat and mutton witnessed a fall of 9.8 %: 55 tonnes in January-June 2003 against 61 tonnes in January-June 2002. The share of local production inclusive of imports from Rodrigues stood at 36.8%.

The production of pork went up slightly by 0.8%, from 357 tonnes in the first semester of 2002 to 360 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2003.

7. Fish

Total fish production declined by 4.8%, from 4,788 tonnes in first semester of 2002 to 4,558 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2003.
