

## External Trade – 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2003

### Introduction

This issue of the Social and Economic Indicators presents external trade statistics for the fourth quarter of 2003 and for the years 2002 and 2003. While figures for 2002 are final, those for 2003 are subject to revision in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for. However, it was not possible before the first quarter of 2002 to include Freeport transactions in our general trade statistics because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority. Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it possible to integrate data of the Freeport zone with those of Customs.

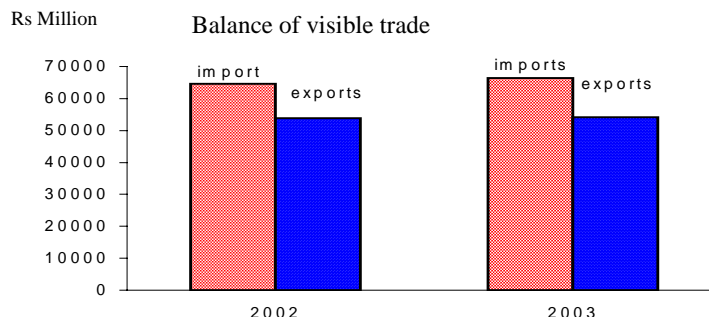
As from 2002, data on imports and exports include transactions through the Mauritius Freeport. Thus, data for 2002 and 2003 presented in this Indicator are not comparable with those for the previous periods. It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius because it is not possible to distinguish between domestic exports and re-exports of freeport licensees. It is estimated that currently some 38% of freeport exports are sourced locally.

Three new tables have been introduced as from 2003 : re-exports of main commodities by section (Table 7), domestic exports by country of destination (Table 9) and re-exports by country of destination (Table 10).

### 1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the fourth quarter of 2003 was valued at Rs 33,513 million, a figure which is 3.9% higher than that of the previous quarter and 1.2% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 2002.

During the fourth quarter of 2003, total exports reached Rs 15,242 million compared to total imports of Rs 18,271 million, thus resulting in a trade deficit of Rs 3,029 million.



Total exports for the year 2003 reached Rs 54,164 million while imports amounted to Rs 66,389 million. The trade deficit amounted to Rs 12,225 million which is 14.1% higher than the figure of Rs 10,715 registered in 2002.

## 2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)

During the fourth quarter of 2003, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, decreased by four percentage points to 92, from 96 in the third quarter (Table 2). This movement was due to a decrease of 1.5% in export prices while import prices increased by 2.1%. It should be noted that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 3 and 4.

## 3. Exports

Total export proceeds for the fourth quarter of 2003, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs 15,242 million, showing a decrease of 0.4% over the previous quarter and an increase of 3.4% over the corresponding quarter of 2002.

Total exports for the year 2003 attained Rs 54,164 million, that is an increase of Rs 271 million (+0.5%) over the corresponding period of 2002.

Domestic exports for the year 2003, which represented about 78% of total exports, decreased by 1% in nominal terms compared to the corresponding period of 2002. This change in value was accompanied by a 6% increase in prices, thus resulting in a 7% decrease in volume.

The table below shows the main changes in domestic exports between 2002 and 2003.

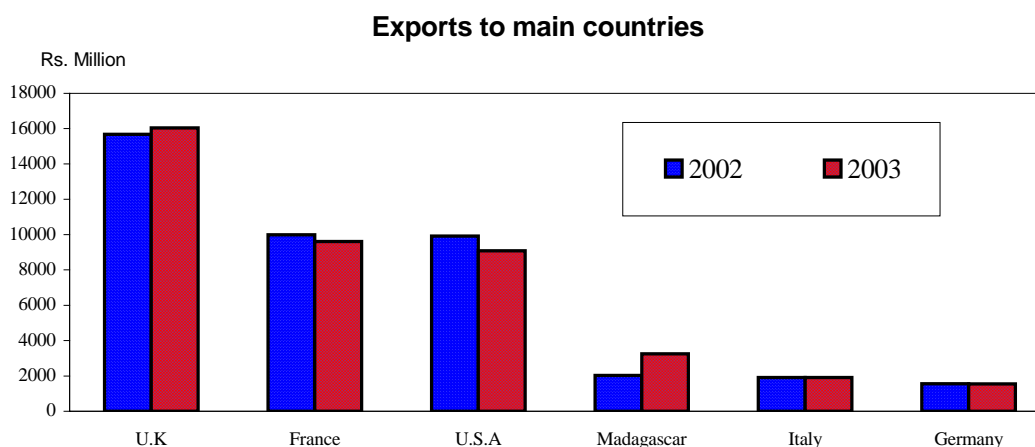

The value of exports of “*Food and live animals*” decreased by 2% as a result of 11% increase in prices, and 12% decrease in volume. Export receipts of “*Chemicals & related products*” went up by 44%, being the combined effect of 4% increase in prices and 38% increase in volume. An increase of 9% was registered in exports of “*Crude materials, inedible, except fuels*” due to a 4% increase in prices and a 5% increase in volume. Exports of “*Miscellaneous manufactured articles*” registered a decrease of 2% in value, following an increase of 6% in prices and a decrease of 8% in volume.

For the year 2003, total exports of “*Articles of apparel and clothing accessories*” amounted to Rs 27,349 million, representing 52% of total exports.

Analysis by country of destination shows that the European countries purchased some 65% of our exports for Rs 33,709 million in 2003. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs 16,035 million, or 31% of total exports, followed by France with Rs 9,616 million (18%) and U.S.A, Rs 9,083 million (17%). The other major markets were Malagasy Republic (6%), Italy (4%) and Germany (3%). Table 8 shows further details.



#### 4. Imports

Total imports for the fourth quarter of 2003 reached Rs 18,271 million, showing an increase of 8% over the previous quarter and a decrease of 1% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2002.

During the year 2003, Mauritius has imported goods worth Rs 66,389 million, that is about 3% more than the preceding year.

Total imports (excluding aircraft) for the year 2003 attained Rs 65,316 million, which is 2% higher than last year. Overall import prices are estimated to have increased by around 7% while import volume decreased by 5%.

During this period, imports of “*Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*” and imports of “*Machinery and transport equipment*” represented 28% and 22% of total imports respectively while imports of “*Food and live animals*” made up for 16%.

Figures for imports by S.I.T.C (Rev 3) sections are compared to those of 2002 below.

Imports of "Crude materials, inedible except fuel" and "Food & live animals" went down by 15% and 9% respectively while those of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" remained almost at the same level. All the other remaining sections registered increases in value ranging from 2% to 26%. In nominal terms, the highest increase was registered in the group "Beverages and tobacco" whose imports value rose by 26% as a result of increases of 20% and 5% in prices and volume respectively. A substantial increase of 15% was also noted in the value of imports of "Chemicals & related products" due to a 10% increase in prices and 5% increase in volume.

Further details by section and commodity are given in tables 11 and 12.

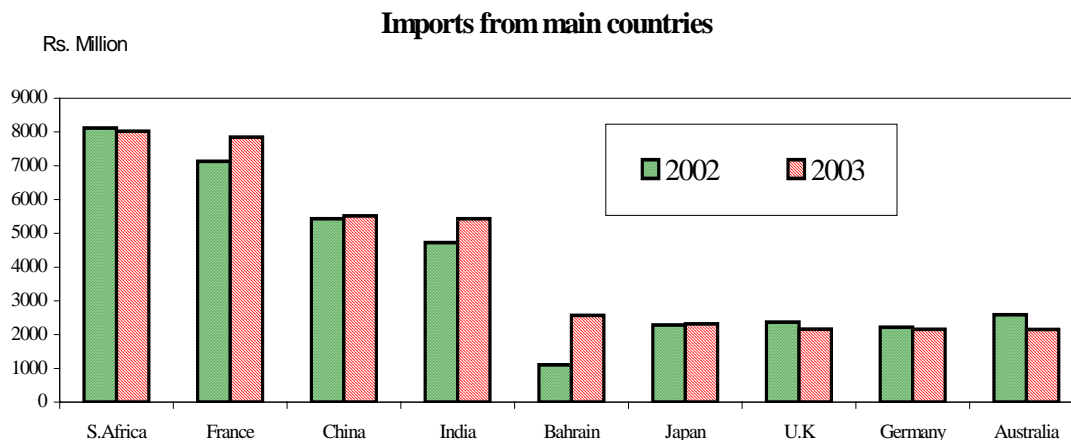


Table 13 shows imports by country of origin. During the year 2003, imports from Asia totalled Rs 28,538 million, representing 43% of total imports for that period. Our main supplier countries were Republic of South Africa (12%), France (12%), China (8%), India (8%), Bahrain (4%), Japan (3%), United Kingdom (3%), Germany (3%) and Australia (3%).

## **5. Trade with Regional Organisations**

Total exports to African, Carribean and Pacific (ACP) States during the fourth quarter of 2003 amounted to Rs 1,256 million, while imports stood at Rs 668 million.

During 2003, total exports to these countries were valued at Rs 4,318 million and imports, Rs 2,687 million (Table 14).

During the fourth quarter of 2003, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs 1,214 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs 658 million, resulting in a favourable balance of Rs 556 million for Mauritius (Table 15).

For the year 2003, total exports to COMESA countries amounted to Rs 4,154 million and imports, Rs 2,534 million. Madagascar was the main buyer (78%) and also the main supplier (53%).

Trade with SADC countries for the fourth quarter showed a deficit of Rs 1,922 million, resulting from imports of Rs 2,264 million and exports amounting to Rs 342 million (Table 16).

For the year 2003, Mauritius imported Rs 8,852 million worth of goods from SADC countries while exports were of the order of Rs 1,350 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (91%). Our main buyers were Republic of South Africa (58%), Seychelles (20%), Zimbabwe (8%) and Tanzania (5%).

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# External Trade

## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS 2002). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

4. **Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
