January to September 2004

1. Passenger Traffic

1.1 Total Passenger Traffic

Passenger traffic for the period January to September 2004 totalled 1,336,206 made up of 665,940 arrivals and 670,266 departures. Compared to the same period of 2003, these figures represent increases of 2.4% in arrivals and 1.3% in departures. Movements by sea accounted for 2.3% of both arrivals and departures. Table 1 shows monthly details of passenger traffic.

1.2 Excursionists

Total arrivals by air included 8,519 "excursionists", i.e. visitors arriving and leaving on the same day. Of these excursionists, 2,386 (28.0%) came from Reunion Island while 1,625 (19.1%) came from France. Total arrivals by sea included 5,252 "cruise excursionists" (2,604 passengers and 2,648 crews) aboard 8 cruise ships which visited our port during the first nine months of 2004.

1.3 Mauritian Residents

During the period under review, the number of Mauritian residents travelling abroad went up by 13.1% from 120,180 in 2003 to 135,873 in 2004 and accounted for 20.3% of total departures. The following trends were recorded in the number of Mauritians visiting the major destinations: Hong Kong (+140.2%), Singapore (+33.9%), Australia (+31.8%), India (+31.3%), United Kingdom (+29.0%), Malagasy Republic (+19.0%), France (+9.1%), Republic of South Africa (-6.2%) and Reunion Island (-7.7%). Table 2 shows a more detailed distribution of countries visited.

1.4 Tourist Arrivals

Tourist arrivals for the first nine months edged 0.5% higher from 500,846 in 2003 to 503,294 in 2004. Further details are given in Tables 3 to 6.

Around 90% of the tourists came mainly for holidays while 4.5% were on business/conference trips, and another 3.6% were in transit (Table 4).

Arrivals from Europe, which accounted for 65.3% of total tourist arrivals, grew by 0.5% to 328,643 during the first nine months of 2004 compared to 327,041 in the same period of 2003. Arrivals from France, our leading market, representing 28% of total tourist arrivals and 42.9% of the European market, increased by 3.9% to reach 140,936. A growth of 7.9% was noted in arrivals from Italy. On the other hand, decline was recorded in arrivals from the other major generating countries: United Kingdom (-2.6%) and Germany (-6.5%). Trends among the other European countries were as follows: Austria (+13.3%), Netherlands (+2.9%), Sweden (-5.8%), Spain (-11.4%), Switzerland (-15.6%) and Belgium (-18.9%).

For the period January to September 2004, arrivals from Africa, with a share of 25.1% of total tourist arrivals, decreased by 1.4% to 126,167. Arrivals from Reunion Island, the major generating country of the region, were down by 2.7%, while those from the Republic of South Africa were up by 15.4%. Changes in arrivals from other African countries were as follows: Zimbabwe (+9.0%), Kenya (+7.8%), Malagasy Republic (-23.4%), Seychelles (-32.1%) and Comoros (-34.6%).

Tourist arrivals from the Asian market grew by 2.5% during the reference period and constituted 6.6% of total tourist arrivals. Arrivals from India, our major source on this continent, fell by 9.1% to reach 17,786. Among the other Asian countries, the following trends were noted: People's Republic of China (+66.3%), Hong Kong (+49.0%), Singapore (+36.9%), Malaysia (+35.8%), Japan (+32.0%), and United Arab Emirates (-28.1%),

Arrivals from Oceania increased by 20.2% mainly due to an expansion of 22.1% in the Australian market.

Arrivals from the continent of America grew by 5.3%, being the net result of increases of 33.9% from Canada and 4.3% from "other American Countries" and a drop of 5.1% from USA.

2. Tourist Nights

The number of nights spent by tourists during the period January to September 2004 is estimated at around 5.0 million, representing a marginal increase of 0.5% over the same period of 2003 (Table 6).

3. Hotel Statistics

At the end of September 2004, there was a total of 98 registered hotels in operation. Owing to renovation, three hotels were not operational. The total room capacity for these registered hotels in operation was 10,008 with 20,115 bed places (Table 7). The room occupancy rate for all hotels for the first nine months of 2004 averaged 60% while the bed occupancy rate was 53% (Table 8).

"Large" hotels, i.e. well-established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms, numbered 39 (40% of all registered hotels). These "Large" hotels had a room capacity of 7,485 with 14,973 bedplaces, representing 74.8% of total room capacity and 74.4% of total bedplaces. The average room occupancy rate for these hotels for the first nine months of 2004 was of the order of 64%, while bed occupancy rate averaged 56% (Table 8).

4. Gross Tourism Receipts

Data from the Bank of Mauritius indicate that gross tourism receipts for the period January to September of 2004 were of the order of Rs 16,847 million, up by 27.2% when compared to Rs 13,242 million for the corresponding period of 2003.

5. Employment

According to the Survey of Employment and Earnings, direct employment in travel and tourism establishments employing 10 persons or more, stood at 22,613 at the end of March 2004, that is 3.4% higher than last year. Of this number, 74.5% or 16,853 were engaged in hotels (Table 9).

6. Forecast Year 2004

Based on the information obtained from the major stakeholders of the tourist industry and latest figures available, there are indications that tourist arrivals for the year 2004 will be around 710,000, i.e 1.1% higher than the figure of 702,018 registered in the preceding year. According to the Bank of Mauritius, tourism receipts for the year 2004 will be around Rs 23,500 million.

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Explanatory Notes

1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying for more than 24 hours but less than a year, who is not involved in any gainful occupation in the country during his/her stay.

2. Transit

A transit passenger is one who stops over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

Type I: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the harbour.

Type II: Passengers who do leave the airport or harbour and stay in the country for more than 24 hours but only for flight connection purposes.Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

Excursionists are non-resident visitors, other than those who do not leave the airport, who stay in the country for less than 24 hours. They also include passengers as well as crews of *cruise ships*.

4. Tourist Nights

"Tourist nights" means the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists, as defined above, during the period under review.

5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

6. CIS

CIS denotes the Commonwealth of Independent States, which consists of the states of the former Soviet Union.

Chart 1 - Monthly Distribution of Tourist Arrivals, January - September of 2003 and 2004




Chart 2 - Tourist Arrivals from Top Ten Markets, January - September of 2003 and 2004


