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# The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises 

## 3rd Quarter 2004

## Introduction

The Central Statistics Office conducts a "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises to collect up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in the different industry sub-groups. This issue of "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the survey carried out at the end of September 2004. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises, the latter being "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving the application of high technology.

The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EPZ imports and exports for the first three quarters of 2004 as well as final figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EPZ sector for the period 1993 to 2003.

## 2. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

### 2.1 Number of enterprises

The number of enterprises at the end of the 3rd quarter 2004 stood at 499, following the closure of 4 enterprises and the coming into operation of 6 new ones during the period under review. The number of enterprises with fewer than 10 workers stood at 140 and represented $28 \%$ of the total number of enterprises but employed less than $1 \%$ of the workforce (Table 1.4).

The number of enterprises in "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EPZ, stood at 223 compared to 222 at the end of June 2004 and 231 a year ago. During the quarter, two new enterprises came into operation and one closed down in this industry group. In "Textile yarn and fabrics", there were 42 enterprises whilst the "Flowers" group was operating with 37 enterprises at the end of September 2004. Other details on the number of enterprises by product group are given in Table 1.2.

### 2.2 Employment evolution, 3rd quarter 2004

During the third quarter of 2004, employment in the EPZ decreased by 2,478 from 70,097 ( 24,690 males and 45,407 females) at the end of June 2004 to 67,619 ( 24,747 males and 42,872 females) at the end of September 2004. Female employment fell by 2,535 whilst male employment increased by 57 (Table 1.4).

During the 3rd quarter, a total of 2,387 jobs were created: 1,042 through expansion in 12 existing enterprises and 1,345 by the 6 new enterprises. On the other hand, 4,865 jobs were lost: 3,987 as a result of reduction in 24 existing enterprises and 878 due to the closure of 4 enterprises (Table 1.5).

An analysis of employment by product group shows that the "Wearing apparel" group registered a decrease of 1,862 in its workforce, bringing the number of employees to 53,170 at the end of the quarter. Within the group, employment declined by 2,090 in "Pullovers" whilst in "Other garments", employment increased by 228. The "Textiles yarn and fabrics" group registered a loss of 578 jobs. Details of changes in employment by product group are shown in Table 1.7.

Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex. Foreign workers, who numbered 13,940 at the beginning of the quarter, decreased by 326 to 13,614 . Among
males, employment went up by 35, whilst among females it declined by 361 . It is to be noted that nearly $90 \%$ of foreign workers was engaged in the"Wearing apparel" sector.

### 2.3 Employment evolution, September 2003 - September 2004

During the one-year period ending September 2004, the number of enterprises decreased from 507 to 499 and total employment fell by 9,419 . Female employment went down by 7,527 and male employment by 1,892 . During the same period, the number of foreign workers declined by 1,506 (Table 1.4).

In "Wearing apparel" group, employment decreased by 8,856 from 62,026 to 53,170. Within the group, employment fell by 4,655 in "Other garments" and by 4,201 in "Pullovers". A significant decrease of 1,023 in the workforce was also noted in the "Textile yarn and fabrics" group whilst the "Food" sector registered an increase of 498. Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

### 2.4 Exports and imports, January to September 2004

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2002 and 2003 are final, those for the period January to September 2004 are subject to revision as and when the Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EPZ exports during the 3rd quarter of 2004 amounted to Rs. 8,022 million bringing the total for the first nine months to Rs. 23,897 million. Compared to the corresponding period of 2003, this represents a nominal increase of $3.5 \%$.

Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing for the first three quarters of 2004 reached Rs. 17,275 million, a decrease of Rs 583 million ( $-3.3 \%$ ) compared to the same period a year ago. Increases are noted in all the other SITC Sections, the significant ones being in "Textile yarn, fabrics and made up articles" (+ Rs. 329 million), "Fish and fish preparations" (+ Rs 246 million) and "Jewellery, goldsmiths and silversmiths wares" (+ Rs. 136 million). Other details of EPZ exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.

The United Kingdom, the United States of America and France remain our principal EPZ markets, accounting for Rs 17,363 million or around $73 \%$ of total exports in the first nine months of 2004. An analysis by country of destination (Table 1.12) shows that exports towards the United Kingdom increased by $19.6 \%$ to reach Rs. 6,832 million. On the other hand, exports to the U.S.A and France fell by $15.3 \%$ and $2.6 \%$ to reach Rs 5,530 million and Rs 5,001 million respectively. Exports in our region show an increase of Rs. 156 million ( $+40.8 \%$ ) towards the Republic of Malagasy and a drop of Rs. 74 million ( $-17.3 \%$ ) towards the Republic of South Africa.

Imports for the period January to September of 2004 amounted to Rs. 13,186 million compared to Rs. 11,510 million for the corresponding period of 2003, representing a nominal increase of $14.6 \%$. Imports of raw materials increased by $7.5 \%$ from Rs. 10,420 million to Rs. 11,203 million, and imports of machinery by $81.9 \%$ from Rs. 1,090 million to Rs. 1,983 million.

Net exports, i.e., exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 10,711 million and its ratio to exports works out to around 45 (Table 1.9).

It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EPZ with the Freeport. EPZ sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales and amounted to Rs. 1,559 million during the first nine months of 2004 compared to Rs. 1,510 million for the corresponding period of 2003, i.e. an increase of around $3.2 \%$. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.

## 3. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

### 3.1 Number of enterprises

During the 3rd quarter of 2004, three new enterprises came into operation and one closed down bringing the total number of PSE enterprises to 260. The highest number of enterprises was in "Other support services" (61), followed by "Light engineering" (44) and "Informatics" (41). Among the 260 PSE enterprises, 87 were "large", that is, having 10 or more employees. Further details are given in Table 2.1

### 3.2 Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of September 2004 was 3,723 (2,746 males and 977 females) showing an increase of 137 over the previous quarter. The "large" enterprises employed 3,191 as against 3,051 at the end of June 2004.

During the quarter under review, 301 jobs were created, 264 following expansion in 47 existing enterprises and 37 by the three new enterprises. On the other hand, 164 jobs were lost: 163 through reduction in 39 existing enterprises and 1 following the closure of the enterprise in "Other support services" (Table 2.4).

The number of expatriates employed in the PSE stood at 197 at the end of September 2004, i.e. at the same level a year ago, and 25 less compared to the figure of 222 at the end of June 2004.
