# The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises 

## 4th Quarter and Year 2004

## Introduction

The Central Statistics Office conducts a "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises to provide up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in the different industry sub-groups. This issue of the "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the survey carried out at the end of December 2004. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises, the latter being "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving the application of high technology.

The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EPZ imports and exports for the 4th quarter and year 2004 as well as revised figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EPZ sector for the period 1994 to 2004.

## 2. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

### 2.1 Number of enterprises

During the 4th quarter of 2004, 5 new enterprises started operation whilst 3 closed down bringing the number of EPZ enterprises at the end of the quarter to 501 compared to 506 enterprises, a year ago (Table 1.5).

During the whole year, 25 enterprises closed down but these were partly offset by 20 new enterprises. In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EPZ, 14 closures were reported and 9 new enterprises came into operation, bringing the total number of enterprises to 224. The distribution of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.2.

### 2.2 Employment evolution, 4th quarter 2004

At the end of December 2004, employment in the EPZ stood at 68,022 showing an increase of 403 over the previous quarter. The number of male employees rose by 146 to 24,893 and female employment went up by 257 to 43,129 (Table 1.4).

As shown in Table 1.5, during the 4th quarter 2004, a total of 2,536 jobs were created: 2,229 through expansion in 11 existing enterprises and 307 by the 5 new enterprises. On the other hand, 2,133 jobs were lost: 1,481 through reduction in 11 existing enterprises and 652 following the closure of the 3 enterprises.

The "Wearing apparel" group registered a rise of 391 in its workforce, the effect of an increase of 852 in the sub-group "Other garments" partially offset by a decrease of 461 in "Pullovers". "Wearing apparel" still remains the most important group in the EPZ with 53,561 employees over a total of 68,022 ( $78.7 \%$ ). Details of employment by product group are shown in Tables 1.6 and 1.7.

Foreign workers, who numbered 13,614 at the beginning of the quarter, increased by 178 during the 4 th quarter to reach 13,792 . Among males, employment went up by 234 , whilst among females it declined by 56 . Around $90 \%$ of foreign workers was engaged in the "Wearing apparel" sector. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex.

### 2.3 Employment evolution, Year 2004

During 2004, employment in the EPZ fell by 9,601 from 77,623 at the end of 2003. Among males, employment went down by 1,767 as against 7,834 among females (Tables 1.6 and 1.7).

In the "Wearing apparel" group, employment declined by 8,953 from 62,514 to 53,561. Within the group, employment fell by 4,351 in "Pullovers" and by 4,602 in "Other garments". A significant decrease was also registered in the "Textile yarn and fabrics" (-869). Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

### 2.4 Exports and Imports, Year 2004

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2002 and 2003 are final, those for the year 2004 are subject to revision as and when the Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EPZ exports for the 4th quarter of 2004 amounted to Rs. 8,473 million, bringing the total for the year to Rs. 32,370 million. Compared to the previous year this represents a nominal increase of $2.9 \%$.

EPZ exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing declined by Rs. 951 million in 2004. As a percentage of total EPZ exports, a decline from $76.9 \%$ in 2003 to $71.7 \%$ in 2004 was noted. Increases were noted in almost all the other product groups, the significant ones being "Textile yarn, fabrics and made up articles" (+Rs. 435 million), Fish and fish preparations" (+Rs. 236 million) and "Jewellery, goldsmiths and silversmiths wares" (+Rs. 205 million). Other details of EPZ exports by section are shown in Table 1.13.

The United Kingdom, the United States of America and France remain our principal EPZ markets, accounting for Rs. 23,344 million or around $72 \%$ of total exports. An analysis by country of destination (Table 1.15) shows an increase of Rs. 1,065 million (+13.6\%) in exports to the United Kingdom whilst exports to the United States of America and France fell by Rs. 1,079 million ( $-12.7 \%$ ) and Rs. 217 million ( $-3.0 \%$ ) respectively. Exports to the Malagasy Republic increased from Rs. 560 million in 2003 to Rs. 700 million in 2004 while a drop of Rs. 112 million (-20.1\%) towards the Republic of South Africa was noted.

EPZ imports for the 4th quarter amounted to Rs. 4,024 million bringing the total for year 2004 to Rs. 17,210 million compared to Rs. 15,579 million for 2003. The bill for raw materials increased by Rs. 670 million ( $+4.8 \%$ ) to Rs. 14,749 million and that for machinery and equipment went up significantly by Rs. 961 million (+64.1\%) to Rs. 2,461 million.

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 15,160 million and its ratio to exports works out to around $47 \%$ compared to $50 \%$ in the previous year (Table 1.12).

It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EPZ with the Freeport. EPZ sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales and amounted to Rs. 2,033 million in 2004 compared to Rs. 1,979 million in 2003, i.e. an increase of around $2.7 \%$. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.

## 3. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

### 3.1 Number of enterprises

During the 4th quarter 2004, two new enterprises started operation while one existing enterprise closed down, bringing the total number of PSE's to 261. Among the enterprises 87 were "large", that is, having 10 or more employees. The highest number of enterprises was in "Other support services" (62), followed by "Light engineering" (44) and "Informatics" (41). Further details are given in Table 2.1.

### 3.2 Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of December 2004 was 3,705 (2,731 males and 974 females) showing a decrease of 18 over the previous quarter but an increase of 352 when compared to December 2003. The "large" enterprises employed 3,165 as against 3,191 at the end of September 2004.

Table 2.4 shows that during the 4th quarter 2004, a total of 263 jobs were created: 214 by 40 existing enterprises and 49 by 2 new enterprises. On the other hand, 45 enterprises reported a total reduction of 249 in their workforce and job losses due to the closure of one enterprise numbered 32 .

The number of expatriates employed in the PSE decreased by 7 during the 4th quarter to reach 190 at the end of 2004.
