Crime statistics, 1993 – 2003 (Police Department)

1. Introduction

This issue of Economic and Social Indicators is the second in the series on criminal offences, based on administrative records of the Police Department. It aims at providing users with some indicators on the level and nature of crime, and its evolution over time.

Criminal offences are unlawful acts for which penalties are provided. The Police classify these offences according to the Mauritian Criminal Code. Offences which the law punishes are crimes, misdemeanours and contraventions. These are defined on page 6. The categorisation does not follow the United Nations classification of offences. However an attempt has been made (Table 7) to classify the Mauritian data according to the UN classification to allow some international comparison.

Statistics presented in this indicator are derived mainly from police records of reported cases and a database of fingerprinted persons with one or more convictions. Information on the workforce and budget of the Police Department is also included.

The published data relate to the Republic of Mauritius. However, some tables showing data for the Island of Mauritius and for Island of Rodrigues are also given. The data cover the period 1993 to 2003, unless otherwise stated.

2. Limitation of data

The statistics on offences presented are based on the current database of reported cases, which are the starting points of police investigation. However, as a case moves through the various stages of investigation, the type of offence and the status of the associated suspect or suspects are liable to changes. Thus, allegations may be withdrawn; the police may find an offence to have no basis or to be different from what was reported; a suspect may be cleared of all charges, while other suspects may be detected. However, the database is not updated to take account of these changes. Hence, analysis of offenders by characteristics such as age and sex is not meaningful. Such analysis is possible only with the database of fingerprinted offenders with one or more convictions.

Care should therefore be taken in interpreting the data, which are also subject to changes in public attitude to offence reporting, changes in classification of offences by type, and the amount of resources mobilised for the tracking of crime.

3. Cases Reported

Cases reported to the Police are either criminal offences or relate to events such as accidental deaths, accidental fires, suicides or attempted suicides and street accidents, which are not connected to any offence.

In 2003, a total of 269,917 cases (265,461 in the Island of Mauritius and 4,456 in Rodrigues) were notified at the Police Department compared to 155,572 (152,259 in the Island of Mauritius and 3,313 in Rodrigues) in 1993. This represents an increase of 73% (74% in the Island of Mauritius and 35% in Rodrigues) over the period under review.

The percentage of reported cases connected to an offence increased from 63% (98,023) in 1993 to 72% (194,532) in 2003. The proportions were more or less similar for the Island of Mauritius and for Rodrigues.

4. Offences by type

Trends in the different types of offences during the period 1993 to 2003 for the Republic of Mauritius, Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues are shown in Tables 1, 3 and 5 respectively.

The total number of offences in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 98% from 98,023 in 1993 to 194,532 in 2003. The number of crimes more than doubled from 3,808 in 1993 to 7,760 in 2003; misdemeanours increased by 4% from 32,364 to 33,615 while contraventions increased by 148% from 61,851 to 153,157 (Table 1 and Figure 1).

During the same period, the number of offences in the Island of Mauritius nearly doubled from 95,962 to 191,296 following increases in the number of crimes (103%), misdemeanours (3%) and contravention (150%).

In Rodrigues, the number of offences increased by 57% from 2,061 in 1993 to 3,236 in 2003. The number of crimes more than tripled while misdemeanours increased by around 61% and contraventions by 52% (Table 5).

The proportion of crimes in the Republic of Mauritius which was 4% in 1993 remained at the same level in 2003; misdemeanours decreased from 33% to 17% while contraventions increased from 63% to 79%. Similar trends were noted for the Island of Mauritius. In Rodrigues, the proportion of crimes increased from 2% to 4%, misdemeanours increased from 25% to 26% while contraventions decreased from 73% to 70%.

The above analysis should be treated with caution since, prior to 2001, the Police classified all offences related to drugs as misdemeanours, whether the offence was a crime, a misdemeanour or a contravention. As from 2001, these offences have been classified as crimes. Furthermore, the relatively high increase in the number of contraventions in 2001, 2002 and 2003 particularly in the Island of Mauritius could be due to a more intense activity as regards road checks by the Traffic Branch of the Police Department, and the use of more sophisticated equipment to detect speeding and driving under the influence of liquor.

Because the number of offences recorded over time is affected by the size of the population, a better picture of the trend is given by the offence rate, defined as the number of offences per 1,000 mid-year population. Tables 2, 4 and 6 show the trends in the rates of the various offences from 1993 to 2003 for the Republic of Mauritius, Island of Mauritius and Rodrigues respectively.

The rate for all offences for the Republic increased from 89 in 1993 to 159 in 2003. The crime rate, which was 4 per 1,000 population in 1993 increased by 50% to reach 6 in 2003. The misdemeanour rate decreased from 30 in 1993 to 28 in 2003. However, higher misdemeanour rates were registered during intervening years; rates as high as or higher than 30 were noted in 1993, 1994 and 1997. The contravention rate increased by 123% from 56 in 1993 to 125 in 2003, with the highest rates being registered during the past three years.

In 2003, the rate for all offences worked out 161 for the Island of Mauritius compared to 89 for Rodrigues. The crime rate was 6, that is, twice the Rodrigues figure of 3; the misdemeanour rate was 28 compared to 23 and the contravention rate 127 compared to 63.

4.1 Selected offences

Table 7 shows offences in the Republic of Mauritius for the years 1999 to 2003, categorized according to the classification used by the UN Survey of Crime Trends and Operations of Criminal Justice Systems, modified to take into consideration local criminal laws.

During the period 1999 to 2003, homicides and related offences in the Republic increased by 21% from 80 to 97 while sexual offences, which was 208 in 1999 increased by 43% to 298 in 2003. On the other hand, assaults and related offences stagnated around 12,700.

Larceny increased by 4% from 13,955 in 1999 to 14,548 in 2003. Available data indicate that larceny on motor vehicles more than doubled during the period 2001 to 2003 increasing from 433 to 988 while larceny on cellular phone/pagers almost tripled from 334 to 928.

4.2 Status of offences

Table 8 and Figure 2 show the status of offences for the period 1999 to 2003 for the Republic of Mauritius. Some offences are taken to court after investigation. Others are not, either because the offenders have not been identified, or there is insufficient evidence to proceed further, or the allegations are withdrawn by the complainant.

The proportion of offences that were taken to court increased from 48% in 1999 to 58% in 2003. Offences that were not taken to court decreased from 23% in 1999 to 16% in 2003 while offences pending investigation decreased from 29% to 26%.

4.3 Offences involving juveniles

The number of offences involving juveniles (defined as persons aged 12 to 17 years) in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 29% from 221 (219 in the Island of Mauritius and 2 in Rodrigues) in 1993 to 284 (280 in the Island of Mauritius and 4 in Rodrigues) in 2003. Alongside, the number of juveniles involved increased by 26% from 237 to 299. The juvenile delinquency rate (defined as the number of juveniles involved in offences per 1,000 mid-year population aged 12 to 17 years) rose from 1.7 in 1993 to 2.5 in 2003. Table 9 and

Figure 3 however show that the juvenile delinquency rate increased during the period 1993 to 1996; thereafter it declined till 2000 before rising again.

The juvenile delinquency rate for Island of Mauritius increased from 1.8 in 1993 to 2.6 in 2003 with a trend similar to that of the Republic (Table 10). That for Rodrigues shows a marginal decrease from 0.7 to 0.6, however, rates higher than 2.0 were registered in 1994, 1995, 2001 and 2002 (Table 11).

Table 12 shows that in 1993 larceny was the main juvenile offence in the Republic and involved 91 juveniles (38%). In 2003, the most common offence was assault involving 129 juveniles (43%) and traffic contravention involving another 84 (28%).

4.4 Characteristics of fingerprinted offenders

The analysis made below is based on records of fingerprinted offenders with one or more convictions.

Table 13 shows that the number of fingerprinted offenders in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 78% from 3,730 (3,686 in the Island of Mauritius and 44 in Rodrigues) in 1993 to 6,646 (6,561 in the Island of Mauritius and 85 in Rodrigues) in 2003.

During the same period, offenders aged less than 18 years decreased by 58% from 341 to 144. Offenders in the age bracket 18 to 21 years increased by 79% from 468 to 837 while those aged 22 years or more almost doubled from 2,921 in 1993 to 5,665 in 2003 (Table 14).

The proportion of fingerprinted offenders aged less than 18 years fell from 9% in 1993 to 2% in 2003. Those in the age bracket 18 to 21 years remained at 13% while those aged 22 years or more grew from 78% to 85%.

The proportion of male offenders was around 95% throughout the period.

Table 15 and Figure 5 show that the number of first-time offenders in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 49% from 1,643 in 1993 to 2,456 in 2003. An increase of 77% was noted among both offenders with 1 previous conviction which increased from 1,201 to 2,131 and among offenders with 2 to 5 previous convictions which grew from 648 to 1,146. Those with 6 or more convictions increased by nearly 300% from 238 in 1993 to 913 in 2003.

5. Offences under the Road Traffic Act

Available data indicate that the number of offences under the Road Traffic Act in the Republic of Mauritius which was 42,693 in 1999 more than tripled to reach 140,959 in 2003 (Table 16). Similarly, road traffic offences per thousand population more than tripled, increasing from 36 in 1999 to 115 in 2003.

Offences related to dangerous driving increased by 24% from 1,871 in 1999 to 2,312 in 2003. Cases of driving under the influence of liquor more than doubled increasing from

668 in 1999 to 1,414 in 2003. Speeding offences were almost 12 times higher, increasing from 2,713 in 1999 to 32,235 in 2003. As explained earlier, the main reason for these increases is better traffic surveillance and better equipment at the disposal of the Traffic Branch.

6. Offences under the Dangerous Drugs Act

The number of drug offences, which stood at 2,096 in 1999 in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 62% to 3,387 in 2003 (Table 17). Offences related to heroin increased by nearly 300% from 550 in 1999 to reach 2,111 in 2003. During the same period, cases related to gandia (cannabis) declined by 19% from 1,439 to 1,159.

The proportion of offences related to heroin increased from 26% in 1999 to 62% in 2003 while that related to gandia dropped from 69% to 34%.

7. Employment in the Police Department

The number of police stations including police posts in the Republic of Mauritius increased from 91 in 1994 to 97 in 2003. The police force increased by 37% from 8,194 (7,940 men and 254 women) to 11,224 (10,665 men and 559 women) during the same period. Consequently, the police force per 1,000 population increased from 7.4 in 1994 to 9.2 in 2003 (Table 18).

8. Budget of the Police Department

The total expenditure of the Police Department of the Republic increased by 116% from Rs 1,088 Mn for 1993/1994 to Rs 2,353 Mn in 2002/2003 (Table 19). However, its share in total government expenditure decreased from 6.8% in 1993/1994 to 5.7% in 2002/2003.

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Definitions

- 1. **Offences** punishable by the law are crimes, misdemeanours and contraventions
- 2. **Crimes** are defined as offences that are punishable by
 - (a) penal servitude;
 - (b) a fine exceeding 5,000 rupees.
- 3. **Misdemeanours** are defined as offences that are punishable by
 - (a) imprisonment for a term exceeding 10 days;
 - (b) a fine exceeding 5000 rupees.

Where the punishment of imprisonment is imposed, the Court may inflict that punishment with or without hard labour.

- 4. **Contraventions** are defined as offences that are punishable by
 - (a) imprisonment for a term not exceeding 10 days;
 - (b) a fine not exceeding 5000 rupees.
- 5. "Crime rate" is defined as the number of reported crimes per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 6. **"Misdemeanour rate"** is defined as the number of reported misdemeanours per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 7. **"Contravention rate"** is defined as the number of reported contraventions per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 8. **"Juveniles"** are persons aged 12 to 17 years.
- 9. **"Juvenile delinquency rate"** is defined as the number of juveniles involved in offences per 1,000 mid-year population aged 12 to 17 years.




Figure 1 - Reported offence and rates: crimes. misdemeanours and contraventions -

Figure 2 - Offences by status - Republic of Mauritius, 1999 - 2003




