# The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises 

## 3rd Quarter 2005

## 1. Introduction

The Central Statistics Office conducts a "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises to provide up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in the different industry sub-groups. This issue of the "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the survey carried out at the end of September 2005. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises, the latter being "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving the application of high technology.

The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EPZ imports and exports for the first three quarters of 2005 as well as revised figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EPZ sector for the period 1994 to 2004.

## 2. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

### 2.1 Number of enterprises

The number of enterprises at the end of the 3rd quarter 2005 stood at 497 compared to 498 at the end of June 2005 and 499 a year ago.

During the third quarter, 4 enterprises closed down and 3 new ones came into operation resulting in a net loss of one enterprise. In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EPZ, four enterprises closed down and one new one came into operation bringing the number of enterprises to 216 compared to 219 at the end of the previous quarter. The distribution of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.2.

### 2.2 Employment evolution, 3rd quarter 2005

During the third quarter of 2005, employment in the EPZ decreased by 1,514 from 67,402 ( 25,043 males and 42,359 females) at the end of June 2005 to 65,888 ( 25,618 males and 40,270 females) at the end of September 2005. Female employment fell by 2,089 whilst male employment increased by 575 (Table 1.4).
A total of 1,768 jobs was created: 1,678 through expansion in existing enterprises and 90 by the 3 new enterprises. On the other hand, 3,282 jobs were lost: 1,966 through reduction in existing enterprises and 1,316 following the closure of 4 enterprises (Table 1.5).

The "Wearing apparel" group registered a decrease of 1,757 in its workforce from 51,725 at the end of the previous quarter to 49,968 while the "Food" group registered an increase of 299. Within the "Wearing apparel" group, employment declined by 1,906 in "Other garments", but increased by 149 in "Pullovers". Details of employment by product group are shown in Tables 1.6 and 1.7.

Foreign workers decreased from 13,615 at the end of June 2005 to 13,368 at the end of September 2005 (Table 1.4). Employment went up by 636 among males, but decreased by 883 among females. Nearly $85 \%$ of foreign workers was engaged in the "Wearing apparel" group. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex.

### 2.3 Employment evolution, September 2004 - September 2005

During the one-year period ending September 2005, the number of enterprises in the EPZ decreased by two and employment by 1,731. Among females, employment decreased by 2,602 while among males, it increased by 871 . Expatriate employment declined by 246 (Tables 1.4 and 1.8).
In the "Wearing apparel" group, employment declined by 3,202 from 53,170 to 49,968. Within the group, employment fell by 2,078 in "Other garments" and by 1,124 in "Pullovers". Significant increases were registered in the "Food" group (+952) and "Textile yarn and fabrics" group (+509). Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

### 2.4 Exports and Imports, 3rd quarter 2005

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2003 and 2004 are final, those for the first three quarters of 2005 are subject to revision as and when the Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EPZ exports during the 3rd quarter of 2005 amounted to Rs. 7,197 million, that is, $6.5 \%$ lower compared to the previous quarter and $9.5 \%$ lower compared to the corresponding quarter of 2004 (Table 1.9).

EPZ imports for the 3rd quarter of 2005 was estimated at Rs 3,993 million. This represents a decrease of $11.0 \%$ over the previous quarter and a decrease of $10.3 \%$ compared to the corresponding quarter of 2004.

### 2.5 Exports and Imports, January to September 2005

Total exports for the first nine months of 2005 amounted to Rs. 21,444 million representing Rs. 2,262 million or $9.5 \%$ less than the corresponding period of 2004.
Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing for the first nine months of 2005 reached Rs. 14,227 million, a decrease of Rs 2,958 million ( $-17.2 \%$ ) compared to the same period a year ago. This decrease was partially offset by increases in some other product groups of which "Fish and fish preparations" (+Rs. 579 million), "Pearls, precious and semi-precious stones" (+Rs. 157 million) and "Jewellery, goldsmiths and silversmiths wares" (+Rs. 39 million). Other details of EPZ exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.
The United Kingdom, the United States of America and France remain our principal EPZ markets, accounting for Rs. 15,289 million or around $71 \%$ of total exports for the first nine months of 2005. Compared to the corresponding period of 2004, decreases in exports were noted in all these markets, with reductions of Rs. 1,321 million (-24.1\%) to the United States of America, Rs. 564 million ( $-11.3 \%$ ) to France and Rs. 102 million ( $-1.5 \%$ ) to United Kingdom. Exports to the Malagasy Republic increased by $6.4 \%$ from Rs. 528 million to Rs. 562 million while a drop of Rs. 28 million ( $-8.0 \%$ ) towards the Republic of South Africa was noted (Table 1.12).
EPZ imports for the period January to September 2005 amounted to Rs. 11,915 million compared to Rs. 13,176 million for the corresponding period of 2004, representing a decrease of $9.6 \%$. Imports of raw materials decreased by Rs. 825 million (-7.4\%) from Rs. 11,193 million to Rs. 10,368 million and that for machinery and equipment by Rs. 436 million (-22.0\%) from Rs. 1,983 million to Rs. 1,547 million.

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports for the first nine months of 2005, amounted to Rs. 9,529 million and its ratio to exports works out to around $44 \%$ (Table 1.9).
It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EPZ with the Freeport. EPZ sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales. It was valued at Rs. 1,607 million for the first nine months of 2005 compared to Rs. 1,559 million for the corresponding period of 2004. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.

## 3. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

### 3.1 Number of enterprises

The number of enterprises at the end of September 2005 stood at 261, i.e. at the same level as at the end of the previous quarter, or one more compared to the same period a year ago. Among the enterprises 88 were "large", that is, having 10 or more employees. The highest number of enterprises was in "Other support services" (61), followed by "Light engineering" (46) and "Informatics" (41). Further details are given in Table 2.1.

### 3.2 Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of September 2005 was 3,910 (2,895 males and 1,015 females) showing a decrease of 87 ( $-2.2 \%$ ) over the previous quarter. The "large" enterprises employed 3,399 against 3,442 at the end of June 2005.

Table 2.4 shows that during the 3rd quarter 2005, a total of 131 jobs was created following expansion in 34 existing enterprises. On the other hand, 218 jobs were lost through reduction in 28 enterprises.

The number of expatriates employed in the PSE stood at 222 at the end of September 2005 compared to 219 at the end of June 2005 and 197 a year ago.
