POPULATION AND VITAL STATISTICS REPUBLIC OF MAURITIUS, JANUARY - JUNE 2006

1. Introduction

This issue of Economic and Social Indicator presents population estimates for mid-year 2006 and vital statistics for the first semester of 2006. It also includes forecasts of vital events and rates for the year 2006.

It is to be noted that as from January 2005, data for the compilation of vital statistics is being extracted from the computerised system in place at the Central Civil Status Office. Previously, all civil status offices were manually filling in a statistical form for each vital event registered. These forms were subsequently submitted to the Central Statistics Office where they were coded and edited prior to data capture at the Central Informatics System Division.

2. Population estimates, 1st July 2006

As at 1st July 2006, the population of the Republic of Mauritius was estimated at 1,252,989 of whom 619,447 were males and 633,542 females, resulting in a sex ratio of 97.8 males per 100 females.

Given a population of 1,243,541 in the Republic of Mauritius at mid-2005, the population growth during the period July 2005 to June 2006 is estimated at around 0.8%. The population of the Island of Mauritius also grew at a rate of 0.8%, rising from 1,206,345 (596,497 males and 609,848 females) to 1,215,621 (600,905 males and 614,716 females). Over the same period, the population of Rodrigues grew at a lower rate of 0.5% from 36,907 (18,288 males and 18,619 females) to 37,079 (18,349 males and 18,730 females).

The Republic of Mauritius, with a total land area of 2,040 square kilometres, had a population density of around 614 persons per square km in mid-2006. The population densities of the Island of Mauritius and the Island of Rodrigues were 652 and 357 respectively (Table 1).

3. Components of population growth

Table 3 shows the contribution of each component of population growth, namely natural increase and net international migration, to the population increase of 4,404 persons in the first semester of 2006. This was the result of an excess of 4,164 live births over deaths (natural increase) and a gain of 240 persons due to excess arrivals over departures (net international migration).

4. Vital Statistics and rates

Table 4 shows some vital statistics for 2005 and 2006 while Table 5 gives a series of rates for the years 2004 to 2006 for the Republic of Mauritius, the Island of Mauritius and the Island of Rodrigues.

4.1 Live births

During the first semester of 2006, 9,066 live births were registered in the Republic of Mauritius, 5.8% less than in the corresponding period of 2005. For the year 2006, the number of live births is forecast at 18,470 resulting in a crude birth rate of 14.7 live births per 1,000 mid-year population compared to 15.1 in 2005. The forecast for the Island of Mauritius is 17,600 live births in 2006 (rate of 14.5). For Rodrigues, it is 870 (rate of 23.6).

4.2 Deaths

During the first six months of 2006, 4,902 deaths were registered in the Republic of Mauritius, 703 more or 16.7% higher than in the corresponding period of 2005 (4,199). This abnormally high increase reflects a higher death toll among the elderly aged 60 years and above. In fact, there were 533 or 19.8% more deaths among the elderly in the first semester of 2006 (3,224) as compared to the first semester of 2005 (2,691). It is estimated that the total number of deaths for the year 2006 will be around 9,300 for the Republic, leading to a crude death rate of 7.5 deaths per 1,000 mid-year population compared to 7.0 in 2005. The expected number of deaths in 2006 for the Island of Mauritius and the Island of Rodrigues are 9,100 (rate of 7.5) and 230 (rate of 6.2) respectively.

4.3 Infant deaths

During the period January to June 2006, 152 infant deaths were registered in the Republic of Mauritius against 135 during the same period in 2005, i.e an increase of 12.6%. For the year 2006, around 260 infant deaths are expected for the Republic, giving an infant mortality rate of 14.1 infant deaths per 1,000 live births against 13.2 in 2005. The forecast for 2006 are 240 (rate of 13.6) for the Island of Mauritius and 20 (rate of 22.9) for the Island of Rodrigues.

4.4 Still births

During the first semester of 2006, 83 still births were registered in the Republic of Mauritius against 93 in the same period of 2005, i.e a 10.8% decrease. For the year 2006, the number of still births expected for the Republic of Mauritius is 180, giving a still birth rate of 9.6 still births per 1,000 total births against 9.7 in 2005. The number of still births forecast for the Island of Mauritius and the Island of Rodrigues in 2006 are 160 (rate of 9.0) and 20 (rate of 22.3) respectively.

4.5 Marriages

A total of 5,116 marriages were registered in the Republic of Mauritius during the first semester of 2006 representing an increase of 1.8% over the number registered during the same period in 2005 (5,024). The number of marriages forecast for 2006 is 11,370 giving a crude marriage rate of 18.2 same as in 2005. The expected number of marriages in 2006 for the Island of Mauritius and the Island of Rodrigues are 11,150 (rate of 18.3) and 220 (rate of 12.1) respectively.

2. Sex ratio : The number of males to every 100 females.

3. Natural increase : The excess of live births over deaths.

4. Crude birth rate : The number of live births in a year per

1,000 mid-year population.

5. Crude death rate : The number of deaths in a year per 1,000

mid-year population.

6. Infant mortality rate : The number of deaths in a year of infants

aged under one year per 1,000 live births

during the year.

7. Still birth rate : The number of still births in a year per

1,000 total births (live births and still

births) during the year.

8. Marriage rate : The number of persons married in a year

per 1,000 mid-year population.

9. Divorce rate : The number of persons to whom divorce is

granted in a year per 1,000 mid-year

population.
