AGRICULTURAL AND FISH PRODUCTION (January - June 2006)

1. Introduction

This issue of Economic and Social Indicators presents data on agricultural and fish production for the Island of Mauritius for the first six months of 2006, as well as revised figures for year 2005. Table 1 shows area harvested and production in respect of the main agricultural crops while Table 2 shows production of the main agro-industrial products.

2. Sugar cane

At the end of June 2006, around 2,800 hectares under sugar cane were harvested, yielding 218,210 tonnes of sugar cane and 19,246 tonnes of sugar. The corresponding figures for the same period in the preceding year were 3,800 hectares, 307,346 tonnes of sugar cane and 27,670 tonnes of sugar respectively. The average extraction rate as at June 2006 was 8.82% compared to 9.00% a year ago. More details relative to sugar are given in Table 3.

According to the Mauritius Chamber of Agriculture, production of sugar for the crop year 2006 will be around 500,000 tonnes.

3. Tea

At the end of June 2006, area under tea plantation stood at 670 hectares, the same level as at June 2005.

Production of green tea leaves during the first semester of 2006 increased by 2.9%: 4,426 tonnes as compared to 4,302 tonnes for the same period of 2005. A breakdown of production by type of producer is given in Table 4.

Production of black tea went up by 5.3%, from 847 tonnes in the first semester of 2005 to 892 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2006 (Table 2).

4. Tobacco

An area of 95 hectares under tobacco cultivation was harvested during the first semester of 2006, against to 98 hectares for the corresponding period of 2005. The production of tobacco leaves increased by 11.3% from 97 tonnes to 108 tonnes.

5. Foodcrops

Data on food crops production are supplied by the Agricultural Research and Extension Unit (AREU). These figures are thereafter adjusted to take into account backyard production of banana, eddoes, manioc and sweet potato.

Area harvested registered an increase of 15.9% from 2,727 hectares in January-June 2005 to 3,161 hectares in the corresponding period of 2006, while production increased by 29.5% from 30,934 tonnes to 40,051 tonnes.

6. Livestock

During the first six months of 2006, the production of beef from live cattle was 935 tonnes, which is 16.9% higher than the figure of 800 tonnes registered in the corresponding period of 2005. Beef production from the slaughter of imported cattle, accounting for 95.9% of the total production, increased by 17.6%, from 763 tonnes to 897 tonnes. Local production which accounts for only 4.1% of total beef production rose by 2.7% from 38 tonnes to 37 tonnes.

The production of goat meat and mutton witnessed a decrease of 14.1%: 55 tonnes in the first semester of 2006 against 64 tonnes in January-June 2005. The share of local production, inclusive of imports from Rodrigues, stood at 25.2%.

The production of pork decreased by 3.0%, from 328 tonnes in the first semester of 2005 to 318 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2006.

7. Poultry

The production of poultry increased by 11.8%, from 17,000 tonnes in the first semester 2005 to 19,000 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2006.

8. Fish

Total fish production increased by 23.7%, from 4,550 tonnes in first semester of 2005 to 5,628 tonnes in the corresponding period of 2006. Fresh coastal fish catch increased by 9.2%, while other catch (tuna, bank etc) rose by 27.6%.
