# The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises 

## 2nd Quarter 2006

## 1. Introduction

The Central Statistics Office conducts a "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises to provide up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in the different industry sub-groups. This issue of the "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the survey carried out at the end of June 2006. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises, the latter being "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving the application of high technology.
The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EPZ imports and exports for the first two quarters of 2006 as well as revised figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EPZ sector for the period 1995 to 2005.

## 2. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

### 2.1 Number of enterprises

The number of enterprises at the end of the 2nd quarter of 2006 stood at 477 compared to 484 at the end of March 2006 and 498 a year ago.
During the 2nd quarter, 8 enterprises closed down of which 2 in "Wearing apparel" and 3 in "Other manufacturing" and one new enterprise came into operation resulting in a net loss of 7 enterprises.
In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EPZ, the number of enterprises at the end of June 2006 stood at 206 compared to 207 at the end of March 2006, and 218 a year ago. The distribution of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.2.

### 2.2 Employment evolution, 2nd quarter 2006

During the 2nd quarter of 2006, employment in the EPZ decreased by 342 from 65,551 ( 24,581 males and 40,970 females) at the end of March 2006 to 65,209 ( 24,837 males and 40,372 females) at the end of June 2006. Male employment went up by 256 while female employment decreased by 598 (Table 1.4).
As shown in Table 1.5, during the second quarter of 2006, a total of 1,547 jobs was created: 1,508 through expansion in existing enterprises and 39 by one new enterprise. On the other hand, 1,889 jobs were lost: 1,668 through reduction in existing enterprises and 221 following the closure of the 8 enterprises.

The "Wearing apparel" group registered a decrease of 229 in its workforce from 48,467 at the end of the previous quarter to 48,238 at the end of June 2006. Within the group, employment declined by 140 in "Pullovers" and by 89 in "Other garments". The "Textile yarn and fabrics" group registered an increase of 118 while "Food" decreased by 164. Details of employment by product group are shown in Tables 1.6 and 1.7.
Foreign workers increased by 124 from 13,997 at the end of March 2006 to 14,121 at the end of June 2006 (Table 1.4). Employment went up by 78 among males and by 46 among females. Around $83 \%$ of foreign workers was engaged in the "Wearing apparel" group. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex.

### 2.3 Employment evolution, June 2005 - June 2006

Comparison of June 2005 and June 2006 figures shows a decrease of 21 in the number of enterprises and a decrease of 2,193 in the EPZ workforce. Female employment fell by 1,987 and male employment by 206. Expatriate employment went up by 506 (Tables 1.4 and 1.8).
In the "Wearing apparel" group, employment declined by 2,909 from 51,147 to 48,238. Within the group, employment fell by 626 in "Pullovers" and by 2,283 in "Other garments". Significant increases were registered in "Textile yarn and fabrics" group $(+703)$ and "Food" group (+433). Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

### 2.4 Exports and Imports, 2nd quarter 2006

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2004 are final, those for the year 2005 and the first two quarters of 2006 are subject to revision as and when the Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EPZ exports during the 2nd quarter 2006 amounted to Rs. 8,861 million i.e. Rs. 2,232 million or $33.7 \%$ higher than the previous quarter and Rs. 1,160 million or $15.1 \%$ higher compared to the corresponding quarter of 2005 (Table 1.9).

EPZ imports during the 2nd quarter of 2006 amounted to Rs. 4,915 million compared to Rs. 4,075 million for the 1st quarter 2006 and Rs. 4,485 million for the corresponding period of 2005. This represents increases of $20.6 \%$ and $9.6 \%$ respectively.

### 2.5 Exports and Imports, January to June 2006

Total exports for the 1st semester 2006 amounted to Rs. 15,490 million. Compared to the corresponding semester of 2005, this represents an increase of Rs. 1,243 million or 8.7\% (Table 1.9).

Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing went up by Rs. 218 million during the first semester of 2006 compared to the corresponding period of last year. During the same period, a significant increase of Rs. 998 million in the exports of fish and fish preparations was registered compared to the corresponding semester of 2005 while, exports of the product group "Textile yarn and fabrics" went up by Rs. 118 million. Other details of EPZ exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.

The United Kingdom, France and the United States of America remain our principal EPZ markets, accounting for Rs. 10,253 million or around 66\% of total exports. Compared to the corresponding semester of 2005, exports to the United Kingdom increased by Rs. 662 million ( $+14.7 \%$ ). On the other hand, decreases in exports of Rs. 600 million $(-22.7 \%)$ to the United States of America and Rs. 59 million ( $-1.9 \%$ ) to France were noted. Exports to the Republic of South Africa went up by $144.4 \%$ from Rs. 198 million to Rs. 484 million and that to the Malagasy Republic by $36.8 \%$ from Rs. 367 million to Rs. 502 million (Table 1.12).
As shown in Table 1.9, EPZ imports during the 1st semester of 2006 amounted to Rs. 8,990 million compared to Rs. 7,922 million for the corresponding period of 2005,
representing an increase of Rs. 1,068 million or $13.5 \%$. Imports of raw materials increased by Rs. 1,135 million ( $+16.8 \%$ ) from Rs. 6,751 million to Rs. 7,886 million and that of machinery and equipment decreased by Rs. 67 million (-5.7\%) from Rs. 1,171 million to Rs. 1,104 million.

During the period January to June 2006, net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 6,500 million and its ratio to total EPZ exports works out to around $42 \%$ compared to $44 \%$ during the same period of 2005 (Table 1.9).
It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EPZ with the Freeport. EPZ sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales. It was valued at Rs. 1,117 million for the 1st semester of 2006 compared to Rs. 1,133 million for the corresponding period of 2005. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.

## 3. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

## $3.1 \quad$ Number of enterprises

During the 2nd quarter 2006, one new enterprise started operation while one existing enterprise closed down, thus keeping the total number of PSE's at the end of June 2006 to 265 . Among the enterprises, 80 were "large", that is, having 10 or more employees. The highest number of enterprises was in "Other support services" (62), followed by "Light engineering" (48) and "Informatics" (43). Further details are given in Table 2.1.

### 3.2 Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of June 2006 was 3,550 (2,705 males and 845 females) showing a decrease of 75 compared to the figure of 3,625 (2,736 males and 889 females) at the end of the previous quarter. The "Large" enterprises employed 2,990 against 3,068 at the end of March 2006.
Table 2.4 shows that during the 2nd quarter 2006, a total of 81 jobs was created: 80 by 27 existing enterprises and 1 by one new enterprise. On the other hand, 33 enterprises reported a total reduction of 150 in their workforce. Job loss due to the closure of one enterprise numbered 6.
The number of expatriates employed in the PSE decreased by 13 during the 2nd quarter 2006 to reach 229 at the end of June 2006 compared to 242 at the end of March 2006.
