# Crime statistics, 1996 – 2006 (Police Department)

#### 1. Introduction

This issue of Economic and Social Indicators (ESI) is the fourth in the series on criminal offences, based on administrative records of the Police Department. It aims at providing users with some indicators on the level and nature of crime, and its evolution over time.

Criminal offences are unlawful acts for which penalties are provided. The Police classify these offences according to the Mauritian Criminal Code. Offences which the law punishes are crimes, misdemeanours and contraventions. These are defined on page 6. The categorisation does not follow the United Nations classification of offences. However an attempt has been made (Table 7) in this ESI to classify the Mauritian data according to the UN classification to allow some international comparison.

Statistics presented in this ESI are derived mainly from police records of reported cases and a database of fingerprinted persons with one or more convictions. Information on the workforce and budget of the Police Department is also included.

The published data relate to the Republic of Mauritius. However, some tables showing data for the Island of Mauritius and for Island of Rodrigues are also given. The data cover the period 1996 to 2006, unless otherwise stated.

## 2. Limitation of data

The statistics on offences presented are based on the current database of reported cases, which are the starting points of police investigation. However, as a case moves through the various stages of investigation, the type of offence and the status of the associated suspect or suspects are liable to changes. Thus, allegations may be withdrawn; the police may find an offence to have no basis or to be different from what was reported; a suspect may be cleared of all charges, while other suspects may be detected. However, the database is not updated to take account of these changes. Hence, analysis of offenders by characteristics such as age and sex is not meaningful. Such analysis is however possible with the database of fingerprinted offenders with one or more convictions, as the latter is updated regularly.

Care should therefore be taken in interpreting the data, which are also subject to changes in public attitude to offence reporting, changes in classification of offences by type, and the amount of resources mobilised for the tracking of crime.

## 3. Cases Reported

Cases reported to the Police are either criminal offences or relate to events such as accidental deaths, accidental fires, suicides or attempted suicides and street accidents, which are not connected to any offence.

In 2006, a total of 255,046 cases (249,885 in the Island of Mauritius and 5,161 in Rodrigues) were notified at the Police Department compared to 222,522 (217,274 in the Island of Mauritius and 5,248 in Rodrigues) in 2005, representing an increase of 14.6%.

Out of the 255,046 cases notified, 190,168 (186,574 in the Island of Mauritius and 3,594 in Rodrigues) were connected to an offence, higher than the 2005 figure of 159,208 (155,420 in the Island of Mauritius and 3,788 in Rodrigues).

The proportion of reported cases connected to an offence increased from 71.5% in 2005 to 74.6% in 2006 in the Republic of Mauritius and in the Island of Mauritius. In Rodrigues, the proportion decreased from 72.2% to 69.6%.

## 4. Offences by type

Trends in the different types of offences during the period 1996 to 2006 for the Republic of Mauritius, Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues are shown in Tables 1, 3 and 5 respectively.

The total number of offences in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 19.4% from 159,208 in 2005 to 190,168 in 2006. This was mainly due to an increase of 28.0% in the number of contraventions (from 110,635 to 141,618) which make up nearly three-quarter of the total number of offences. Drug related offences were also on the rise, up by 8.2% from 3,559 in 2005 to 3,851 in 2006. Conversely, there was a decline in the number of reported crimes by 2.5% (from 5,988 to 5,837) and in the number of misdemeanours by 0.4% (from 39,026 to 38,862).

During the same period, the number of offences in the Island of Mauritius increased by 20.0% following increases in the number of contraventions (28.8%), and drug related offences (8.4%), and decreases in the number of crimes (2.0%) and misdemeanours (0.5%) (Table 3).

In Rodrigues, on the other hand, the number of offences declined by 5.1% (from 3,788 to 3,594), driven by a decrease of 7.9% in the number of contraventions. The number of crimes and drug related offences went down by 23.0% and 27.3% respectively while the number of misdemeanours went up slightly by 3.8%.

Because the number of offences recorded over time is affected by the size of the population, a better picture of the trend is given by the offence rate, defined as the number of offences per 1,000 mid-year population. Tables 2, 4 and 6 give the rates of the various offences from 1996 to 2006 for the Republic of Mauritius and the Islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues respectively.

Between 2005 & 2006, the total number of offences reported at the police increased by 19.4% in the Republic whilst the population increased by 0.8%. The offence rate, therefore, increased by 18.5% from 128.1 per 1,000 population in 2005 to 151.8 in 2006.

In the Island of Mauritius, the overall offence rate went up by 19.2% (from 128.8 to 153.5) while in Rodrigues, the rate declined by 5.5% (from 102.6 to 96.9).

Upon comparing the overall offence rate of the 2 main constituent Islands of the Republic, Rodrigues (rate of 96.9 in 2006) appears to be safer than the Island of Mauritius (rate of 153.5 in 2006). In fact, the rates for 2006 of the different types of offences were lower in Rodrigues than in the Island of Mauritius except for misdemeanours; the misdemeanour rate was almost the same in both islands (at around 31).

#### 4.1 Selected offences

Table 7 shows offences in the Republic of Mauritius for the years 2002 to 2006, categorized according to the UN classification of offences modified to take into consideration local criminal laws.

The number of homicides and related offences in the Republic increased by 13.4% from 97 in 2005 to 110 in 2006. Sexual offences edged up by 33.8% from 314 to 420 and frauds by 4.8% from 580 to 608.

During the same period, there was a slight decrease in the number of assaults and related offences by 1.5% (from 13,331 to 13,129) and a decline of 5.8% in the number of larcenies (from 19,156 to 18,038).

## 4.2 Status of offences

Table 8 and Figure 2 show the status of offences for the period 2002 to 2006 for the Republic of Mauritius. Some offences are taken to court after investigation. Others are not, either because the offenders have not been identified, or there is insufficient evidence to proceed further, or the allegations are withdrawn by the complainants.

In 2005, there were 229,028 offences to be dealt with by the Police. Among them, around 73.0% were investigated. In 2006, the number of offences investigated by the police rose to 207,644 showing an improvement both in the number and proportion of cases (82%) subject to police investigation.

Alternative of the offences investigated, 79% were taken to court in 2006, a higher proportion than in 2005 (77%).

## 4.3 Offences involving juveniles

From 2005 to 2006, the number of offences involving juveniles (defined as persons aged 12 to 17 years) in the Republic of Mauritius increased significantly by 40.9% from 582 (580 in the Island of Mauritius and 2 in Rodrigues) to 820 (817 in the Island of Mauritius and 3 in Rodrigues). The number of juveniles involved increased by 34.0% from 624 to 836. This led to an increase in the juvenile delinquency rate (defined as the number of juveniles

involved in offences per 1,000 mid-year population aged 12 to 17 years) from 4.9 to 6.5 (Table 9 and Figure 3).

The juvenile delinquency rate for the Island of Mauritius was 6.7 in 2006 compared to a low rate of 0.7 for Rodrigues.

Among the 836 juveniles involved in offences in 2006, 4 were involved in intentional homicides, 173 (20.7%) in assaults, 124 (14.8%) in larceny, 57 (6.8%) in sexual offences and the remaining in other offences, which include traffic contravention.

## 4.4 Characteristics of fingerprinted offenders

The analysis made below is based on records of fingerprinted offenders with one or more convictions.

Table 13 shows that the number of fingerprinted offenders in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 11.1% from 6,576 (6,479 in the Island of Mauritius and 97 in Rodrigues) in 2005 to 7,303 (7,185 in the Island of Mauritius and 118 in Rodrigues) in 2006.

During the same period, the number of fingerprinted offenders aged less than 18 years decreased by 26.2% from 107 to 79. Offenders in the age bracket 18 to 21 years decreased marginally from 555 to 550 while those aged 22 years or more increased by 12.9% from 5,914 to 6,674 (Table 14).

In 2006, the majority of the fingerprinted offenders were males (94%). In terms of age around 91.4% were aged more than 22 years, 7.5% between 18 and 21 years and the remaining 1.1% were below 18 years.

The number of first-time offenders in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 7.7% from 2,391 in 2005 to 2,574 in 2006 (Table 15 and Figure 5). The number of offenders with one previous conviction increased by 7.3% from 3,378 to 3,625, those with 2 to 5 previous convictions by 35.7% from 784 to 1,064 and those with 6 or more convictions by 73.9% from 23 to 40.

#### 5. Offences under the Road Traffic Act

Available data indicate that the number of offences under the Road Traffic Act in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 25.0% from 100,686 in 2005 to 125,849 in 2006. The number of road traffic offences per thousand population therefore rose from 81 in 2005 to 100 in 2006 (Table 16).

Offences related to dangerous driving decreased by 3.5% from 1,826 in 2005 to 1,762 in 2006. Cases of driving under the influence of liquor increased by 10.8% from 785 to 870 and speeding offences by 35.7% from 16,682 to 22,642.

## 6. Offences under the Dangerous Drugs Act

The number of drug related offences, which stood at 3,559 in 2005 in the Republic of Mauritius increased by 8.2% to 3,851 in 2006 (Table 17). Increases were noted in offences related to gandia (cannabis) which rose by 15.3% from 1,207 to 1,392, and in offences related to psychotropic and other substances which almost tripled from 473 to 1,172. On the other hand, a decrease of 32.1% from 1,828 to 1,242 was noted in offences related to heroin.

Out of the total number of drug related offences in 2006, some 36.1% were related to gandia, 32.3% to heroin and 30.4% to psychotropic and other restricted substances.

## 7. Employment in the Police Department

The number of police stations including police posts in the Republic of Mauritius which was 94 in 2005 remained the same in 2006. The police force however increased slightly by 1.9% from 11,558 (10,924 men and 634 women) in 2005 to 11,779 (11,130 men and 649 women) in 2006. The police force per 1,000 population increased from 9.3 to 9.4 (Table 18).

## 8. Budget of the Police Department

The total expenditure of the Police Department of the Republic increased by 10.3% from Rs 2,798 Mn in 2004/2005 to Rs 3,085 Mn in 2005/2006 (Table 19). The share of the expenditure of the police expressed as a percentage of total government expenditure, however decreased marginally from 5.9% in 2004/2005 to 5.8% in 2005/2006.

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## **Definitions**

- 1. **Offences** punishable by the law are crimes, misdemeanours and contraventions
- 2. **Crimes** are defined as offences that are punishable by
  - (a) penal servitude;
  - (b) a fine exceeding 5,000 rupees.
- 3. **Misdemeanours** are defined as offences that are punishable by
  - (a) imprisonment for a term exceeding 10 days;
  - (b) a fine exceeding 5,000 rupees.

Where the punishment of imprisonment is imposed, the Court may inflict that punishment with or without hard labour.

- 4. **Contraventions** are defined as offences that are punishable by
  - (a) imprisonment for a term not exceeding 10 days;
  - (b) a fine not exceeding 5,000 rupees.
- 5. **Drug related offences** are as spelt out under the Dangerous Drug Act 2000 and Psychotropic Substances Act 1974. They relate mainly to cultivation of gandia, possession, selling, distribution, and importation of gandia, heroin, hashish, and opium.
- 6. **"Crime rate"** is defined as the number of reported crimes per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 7. **"Misdemeanour rate"** is defined as the number of reported misdemeanours per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 8. **"Contravention rate"** is defined as the number of reported contraventions per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 9. "**Drug rate**" is defined as the number of reported drug offences per 1,000 mid-year population.
- 10. **"Juveniles"** are persons aged 12 to 17 years.
- **"Juvenile delinquency rate"** is defined as the number of juveniles involved in offences per 1,000 mid-year population aged 12 to 17 years.

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








