# The Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) 

## 1st Quarter 2008

## 1. Introduction

Following the repeal of various industrial enactments in the Finance Act 2006, all industrial certificates including the export certificate (EPZ) lapsed on 1 October 2006. To have consistent data series on enterprises involved in manufacturing activities for export, in addition to enterprises formerly holding an EPZ certificate, enterprises manufacturing goods for export and holding a registration certificate issued by the Board of Investment as from 1 October 2006 are also being surveyed. These manufacturing enterprises are now classified as "Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE)".

This issue of "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EOE conducted by the Central Statistics Office at the end of March 2008. It aims at providing up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in enterprises involved in manufacturing activities for export by industrial sub-group.
The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EOE imports and exports for the 1st quarter 2008 as well as revised figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EOE sector for the period 1996 to 2007.

## 2. Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE)

### 2.1 Number of enterprises

The number of export-oriented enterprises at the end of the 1st quarter of 2008 stood at 402 compared to 404 at the end of December 2007 and 425 a year ago.

During the 1st quarter of 2008, 12 enterprises closed down of which 5 in "Wearing apparel" and 4 in "Other manufacturing".

In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EOE, the number of enterprises at the end of March 2008 stood at 174 compared to 177 at the end of December 2007 and 189 a year ago. The distribution of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.2.

### 2.2 Employment evolution, 1st quarter 2008

During the first quarter of 2008, employment in the EOE decreased by 355 from 67,314 ( 28,272 males and 39,042 females) at the end of December 2007 to 66,959 ( 27,256 males and 39,703 females) at the end of March 2008. Female employment went up by 661 whilst male employment fell down by 1,016 (Table 1.4).

A total of 1,398 jobs were created through expansion in existing enterprises. On the other hand, 2,482 jobs were lost: 2,360 through reduction in existing enterprises and 122 following the closure of 12 enterprises (Table 1.5).
Employment in the "Wearing apparel" group decreased by 734 from 49,771 at the end of the previous quarter to 49,037 at the end of March 2008 and that in the "Textile yarn and fabrics" group also fell by 53 from 5,540 to 5,487 . Within the "Wearing apparel" group, employment decreased by 693 in "Pullovers" and by 41 in "Other garments". Details of employment by product group are shown in Tables 1.6 and 1.7.
Foreign workers increased by 36 from 18,412 at the end of December 2007 to 18,448 at the end of March 2008 (Table 1.4). Employment contracted by 832 among males and expanded
by 868 among females. Nearly $84 \%$ of foreign workers were engaged in the "Wearing apparel" group. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex.

### 2.3 Employment evolution, March 2007 - March 2008

Comparison of March 2007 and March 2008, figures show a decrease of 23 in the number of enterprises and an increase of 347 in the EOE workforce. Male employment increased by 1,318 while female employment decreased by 971 . Expatriate employment went up by 2,295 (Tables 1.4 and 1.8).

In the "Wearing apparel" group, employment decreased by 400 from 49,437 to 49,037 . Within the group, employment fell by 579 in "Pullovers" but improved by 179 in "Other garments". Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

### 2.4 Exports and Imports, 1st quarter 2008

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2005 and 2006 are final, those for the year 2007 and 1st quarter 2008 are subject to revision as and when the Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EOE exports during the 1st quarter of 2008 amounted to Rs. 7,693 million, that is Rs 1,861 million or $21.7 \%$ and Rs 465 million or $5.7 \%$ lower compared to the 4th quarter 2007 and the corresponding quarter of 2007 respectively (Table 1.9).

Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing decreased significantly by $21.3 \%$ or Rs 1,330 million during the first quarter 2008 to reach Rs. 4,900 million. Other significant decreases were registered in: "Fish and fish preparations" (-Rs. 510 million or 28.3\%) and "Textile yarn, fabrics, made up articles" (-Rs. 46 million or 10.0\%). Other details of EOE exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.

The United Kingdom, the United States of America and France remain our principal EOE markets, accounting for Rs. 5,013 million or around 65\% of total exports. Compared to the corresponding quarter 2007, exports to the United Kingdom decreased by Rs. 51 million ( $-1.8 \%$ ) and to the United States of America by Rs. 362 million ( $-32.8 \%$ ). On the other hand, export to France rose by Rs 71 million ( $+5.2 \%$ ). During the same period, exports towards the Republic of South Africa decreased by Rs. 6 million ( $-1.8 \%$ ) from Rs. 340 million to Rs. 334 million and that to the Malagasy Republic decreased by Rs. 27 million ( $-9.0 \%$ ) from Rs. 299 million to Rs. 272 million (Table 1.12).

EOE imports for the 1st quarter of 2008 were estimated at Rs 5,834 million. This represents an increase of Rs 764 million or $15.1 \%$ over the previous quarter and an increase of Rs 1,290 million or $28.4 \%$ compared to the corresponding quarter of 2007. Compared to the first quarter of 2007, imports of raw materials increased by Rs. 1,514 million ( $+38.0 \%$ ) from Rs. 3,980 million to Rs. 5,494 million and that of machinery and equipment decreased by Rs. 224 million ( $-39.7 \%$ ) from Rs. 564 million to Rs. 340 million.

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 1,859 million and its ratio to total exports works out to around $24 \%$ compared to $44 \%$ in the corresponding quarter of 2007 (Table 1.9).

It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EOE with the Freeport. EOE sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales. It was valued at Rs. 553 million for the 1st quarter in 2008 compared to Rs. 621 million for the previous quarter and Rs. 725 million for the corresponding period of 2007. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.
