# INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL & TOURISM

## **January to September 2008**

### Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents data on International Travel and Tourism and hotel statistics. A brief on the compilation of these statistics is given at Annex I while Annex II contains a glossary of terms used.

# 2. Passenger Traffic

### 2.1 Total Passenger Traffic

Passenger traffic for the period January to September 2008 totalled 1,807,207, made up of 894,597 arrivals and 912,610 departures. Compared to the same period of year 2007, these figures represent increases of 6.4% in both arrivals and departures. Movements by sea accounted for 3.1% of arrivals and 3.0% of departures. Further details on monthly figures are given in Table 1.

### 2.2 Excursionists

Total arrivals by air included 14,814 "excursionists", i.e. visitors arriving and leaving on the same day. Of these excursionists, 4,402 (29.7%) came from Reunion Island and 3,771 (25.5%), from France. Total arrivals by sea included 17,017 "cruise excursionists" (10,930 passengers and 6,087 crews) aboard 18 cruise ships, which visited our port during the first nine months of 2008.

### 2.3 Mauritian Residents

During the period under review, the number of Mauritian residents travelling abroad went up by 12.3% to 172,935 compared to 153,944 for the first nine months of 2007 (Table 2). The following changes were observed in the number of Mauritians visiting the major destinations: France (+9.3%), United Kingdom (+5.3%), Reunion Island (+6.5%), India (+0.3%), United Arab Emirates (+30.3%), Republic of South Africa (+22.5%), Australia (+48.4%), Hong Kong (+4.5%), Singapore (+13.9%), Malagasy Republic (+0.3%) and Seychelles (+24.6%).

Figure 1 shows the percentage distribution of Mauritian departures by major destination for the period January to September of 2007 and 2008.

### 2.4 Tourist Arrivals




Figure 2 - Monthly Tourist Arrivals, January - September of 2007 and 2008

Tourist arrivals for the first nine months of 2008 increased by 4.6% to reach 674,164 compared to 644,821 for the same period of 2007. Figure 2 shows monthly tourist arrivals for January to September of 2007 and 2008. Further details on tourist arrivals are given in Tables 3 to 6.

Around 88% of the tourists came for holidays while 4.3% were on business/conference trips and another 4.9% were in transit (Table 4).

Arrivals from Europe, which accounted for 64.3% of total tourist arrivals, increased by 3.8% to reach 433,690 during the first nine months of 2008 against 417,779 for the corresponding period of 2007. Arrivals from France, our leading market representing 26.8% of total tourist arrivals and 41.6% of the European market, rose by 10.8% to attain 180,574 during this period. Changes noted in the other three major generating countries of Europe were: United Kingdom (+5.7%), Italy (-5.0%) and Germany (-7.1%). Among the remaining European countries, the following trend was observed: Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) (+19.7%), Spain (+14.6%), Belgium (+8.7%), Netherlands (-2.8%), Switzerland (-10.7%), Sweden (-16.7%) and Austria (-18.8%).

During the first nine months of 2008, arrivals from Africa, with a share of 23.4% of total tourist arrivals, expanded by 3.3% to 157,533. Arrivals from Reunion Island and Republic of South Africa, the two major markets of the region, rose by 0.1% and 7.2% respectively. Changes in arrivals from other African countries were as follows: Malagasy Republic (+25.8%), Kenya (+20.0%), Comoros (+4.6%), Zimbabwe (+2.9%) and Seychelles (-24.4%).

For the period under reference, tourist arrivals from the Asian market, which represented 8.3% of total tourist arrivals, went up by 10.1% to attain 56,064. Arrivals from India, our major source on this continent, grew by 7.7% to reach 34,386. The performance of other Asian countries was as follows: United Arab Emirates (+103.8%), People's Republic of China (+10.7%), Japan (+2.8%), Hong Kong (-9.7%), Singapore (-11.0%) and Malaysia (-20.1%).

Arrivals from Oceania during the reference period contracted by 1.0% from 15,547 in 2007 to 15,386 in 2008 due to a fall of 1.6% in arrivals from Australia, partly offset by an increase of 9.2% in arrivals from the other Oceanian countries.

Arrivals from the continent of America went up by 38.9% to 10,390, due to increases of 39.2% in arrivals from USA, 30.0% from Canada and 47.6% from "Other American" countries.




Figure 3 - Tourist Arrivals from Top Ten Markets, January - September of 2007 and 2008

Tourist arrivals from top ten markets for the period January to September of 2007 and 2008 are given in Figure 3.

# 3. Tourist Nights

Total tourist nights spent in the country during the first nine months of 2008 is estimated at 6.4 million, showing an increase of 6.8% over the same period of the preceding year (Table 6).

## 4. Hotel Statistics

At the end of September 2008, there was a total of 99 registered hotels in operation. Owing to renovation works, five hotels were not operational. The total room capacity for these registered hotels was 10,933 with 21,939 bedplaces (Table 7). For the first nine months of 2008, the room occupancy rate for all hotels averaged 68% compared to 75% in 2007 while the bed occupancy rate was 61% against 67% for 2007 (Table 8).

"Large" hotels, i.e. well-established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms, numbered 43 (43% of all registered hotels). These hotels had a room capacity of 8,342 with 16,730 bedplaces, representing 76% of both total room capacity and total bedplaces. The average room occupancy rate for these hotels for the first nine months of 2008 was 70% and bed occupancy rate averaged 63% compared to 78% and 70% respectively a year ago (Table 8).

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**5. Gross Tourism Receipts** 

Data from the Bank of Mauritius indicate that gross tourism receipts for the first nine months

of 2008 were Rs 30,801 million, i.e. an increase of 8.4% compared to Rs 28,404 million for the same

period of 2007 (Table 6).

6. Employment

According to the Survey of Employment and Earnings, direct employment in hotels,

restaurants and travel and tourism establishments employing 10 persons or more stood at 28,129 at the

end of March 2008 showing an increase of 6.9% over the figure of 26,322 for March 2007. Of this

number, 21,439 or 76.2% were engaged in hotels (Table 9).

7. Forecast Year 2008

Based on data available on tourist arrivals for the first nine months of the year and information

gathered from stakeholders, the forecast of tourist arrivals for the year 2008 has been revised

downwards to 940,000, i.e. +3.6% over the figure of 906,971 in 2007.

According to the Bank of Mauritius, tourism receipts for the year 2008 will be around

Rs 43,100 million (+5.9%) compared to Rs 40,687 million in 2007.

### BRIEF ON COMPILATION OF PASSENGER TRAFFIC STATISTICS

### Sources of data

The main source of data for the compilation of passenger traffic statistics is the Passport and Immigration Office, which maintains a database of all passengers entering and leaving the country. The data are extracted from the Embarkation/ Disembarkation cards filled in by all incoming and outgoing passengers. At the end of every month, passenger traffic for that particular month is downloaded and supplied to the statistics unit of the Ministry of Tourism, Leisure and External Communications within fifteen days. Additional data on cruises are supplied by the Mauritius Ports Authority.

To supplement the recurrent statistics a Survey of Outgoing Tourists (SOT) is conducted every two years since 1984 jointly by the Central Statistics Office and the Ministry of Tourism, Leisure and External Communications. This survey covers a representative sample of tourists at departure and provides qualitative and quantitative information on tourists. Results of the survey are published in the Survey of Outgoing Tourists report.

# **Tourism receipts**

The Bank of Mauritius is responsible for the estimation of tourism receipts based on monthly statements of Inward and Outward Remittances of Commercial Banks.

### **Monthly Occupancy Rates**

All hotels are contacted by phone at the end of every month for data on room/bed nights available and rented during the month for the calculation of room and bed occupancy rates.

### Short-term projections of tourist arrivals

A Tourism Statistics Committee grouping various stakeholders of the tourism industry meet regularly under the chairmanship of the Director of the Central Statistics Office to discuss performance of the tourism sector and to provide information for short-term forecast of tourist arrivals.

### **Publications**

The regular publications of the unit are:

- (i) Monthly tourist arrivals (by mid of each month)
- (ii) Quarterly Economic and Social Indicators on International Travel and Tourism (with a lag of seven weeks)

ANNEX II

### **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

#### 1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying for more than 24 hours but less than a year, who is not involved in any gainful occupation in the country during his/her stay.

#### 2. Transit

A transit passenger is one who stops over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

- *Type I*: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the harbour.
- Type II: Passengers who do leave the airport or harbour and stay in the country for more than 24 hours but only for flight connection purposes.

  Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

# 3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

Excursionists are non-resident visitors, other than those who do not leave the airport, who stay in the country for less than 24 hours. They also include passengers as well as crews of *cruise ships*.

### 4. Tourist Nights

"Tourist nights" means the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists, as defined above, during the period under review.

### 5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

# 6. Occupancy rate

The room/bed occupancy rate is the ratio of room/bed nights rented to the total number of room/bed nights available.

= <u>Total number of room/bed nights rented</u> x 100 Total number of room/bed nights available

### **7. CIS**

CIS denotes the Commonwealth of Independent States. It consists of the States of the former Soviet Union.
