The Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE)

2nd Ouarter 2009

1. Introduction

Following the repeal of various industrial enactments in the Finance Act 2006, all industrial certificates including the export certificate (EPZ) lapsed on 1 October 2006. To have consistent data series on enterprises involved in manufacturing activities for export, in addition to enterprises formerly holding an EPZ certificate, enterprises manufacturing goods for export and holding a registration certificate issued by the Board of Investment as from 1 October 2006 are also being surveyed. These manufacturing enterprises are now classified as "Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE)".

This issue of "Economic and Social Indicators" presents the results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment" among the EOE conducted by the Central Statistics Office at the end of June 2009. It aims at providing up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in enterprises involved in manufacturing activities for export by industrial sub-group.

The Indicator also includes provisional figures on EOE imports and exports for the second quarter of 2009 as well as revised figures for previous years. Table 1.1 shows the main indicators of the EOE sector for the period 1996 to 2008.

2. Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE)

2.1 Number of enterprises

The number of export-oriented enterprises at the end of the 2nd quarter of 2009 stood at 403 compared to 406 at the end of March 2009 and 407 at the end of March 2008 (Table 1.2).

During the 2^{nd} quarter of 2009, 12 enterprises closed down of which 5 in "Wearing apparel" and 2 in "Textile yarn and fabrics" (Table 1.3).

In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EOE, the number of enterprises at the end of June 2009 stood at 160 compared to 165 at the end of March 2009 and 172 at the end of March 2008. The distribution of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.2.

2.2 Employment evolution, 2nd quarter 2009

During the second quarter of 2009, employment in the EOE decreased by 613 from 58,679 (24,944 males and 33,735 females) at the end of March 2009 to 58,066 (24,451 males and 33,615 females) at the end of June 2009. Female employment fell by 120 and male employment by 493 (Table 1.4).

A total of 2,311 jobs were created through expansion in existing enterprises. On the other hand, 3,024 jobs were lost: 2,958 through reduction in existing enterprises and 66 following the closure of 12 enterprises (Table 1.5).

Employment in the "Wearing apparel" group decreased by 434 from 41,657 at the end of the previous quarter to 41,223 at the end of June 2009 and that in the "Textile yarn and fabrics" group also fell by 194 from 4,533 to 4,339. Within the "Wearing apparel" group, employment decreased by 60 in "Pullovers" and by 374 in "Other garments". Details of employment by product group are shown in Tables 1.6 and 1.7.

Foreign workers increased by 248 from 17,025 at the end of March 2009 to 17,273 at the end of June 2009 (Table 1.4). Employment contracted by 96 among males and expanded by 344 among females. Nearly 82% of foreign workers were engaged in the "Wearing apparel" group. Table 1.8 shows expatriate employment by product group and sex.

2.3 Employment evolution, June 2008 – June 2009

Comparison of June 2008 and June 2009, figures show decreases of 4 in the number of enterprises and 6,582 in the EOE workforce. Male employment decreased by 2,469 while female employment decreased by 4,113. Expatriate employment decreased by 868 (Tables 1.4 and 1.8).

In the "Wearing apparel" group, employment decreased by 5,271 from 46,494 to 41,223. Within the group, employment fell by 622 in "Pullovers" and by 4,649 in "Other garments". Details of changes in employment by product group are given in Table 1.7.

2.4 Exports and Imports, 2nd quarter 2009

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA)-Customs Department. Thus while figures for 2008 are final, those for the year 2009, 1st quarter 2009 and 2nd quarter 2009 are subject to revision as and when the MRA-Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Provisional figures show that EOE exports during the 2nd quarter of 2009 amounted to Rs. 9,682 million, that is Rs 1,797 million or 22.8% higher compared to the 1st quarter 2009 and Rs. 562 million or 6.2% higher compared to the corresponding quarter of 2008 respectively (Table 1.9).

Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing increased by 24.7% or Rs 1,205 million during the second quarter 2009 to reach Rs. 6,079 million. Increases were also registered in "Fish and fish preparations" (+Rs. 438 million or 28.5%) and "Pearls and precious & semi-precious stones" (+Rs 98 million or 43.9%). Other details of EOE exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.

The United Kingdom, France and the United States of America remain our principal EOE markets, accounting for Rs. 6,114 million or around 63% of total exports. Compared to the corresponding quarter 2008, exports to the United Kingdom decreased by Rs. 137 million (-4.2%) and to France by Rs. 116 million (-6.0%). On the other hand, exports to the United States of America rose by Rs. 300 million (+35.0%). During the same period, exports towards the Republic of South Africa increased by Rs. 231 million (+85.9%) from Rs. 269 million to Rs. 500 million and that to the Malagasy Republic decreased by Rs. 30 million (-8.5%) from Rs. 351 million to Rs. 321 million (Table 1.12).

EOE imports for the 2nd quarter of 2009 were estimated at Rs. 4,222 million. This represents an increase of Rs 438 million or (+11.6%) over the previous quarter and a decrease of Rs 733 million or (-14.8%) compared to the corresponding quarter of 2008. Compared to the 2nd quarter of 2008, imports of raw materials decreased by Rs. 671 million (-14.3%) from Rs. 4,702 million to Rs. 4,031 million and that of machinery and equipment decreased by Rs. 62 million (-24.5%) from Rs. 253 million to Rs. 191 million (Table 1.9).

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 5,460 million and its ratio to total exports works out to around 56% compared to 46% in the corresponding quarter of 2008 (Table 1.9).

2.5 Exports and Imports, January to June 2009

Total exports for the 1st semester 2009 amounted to Rs. 17,567 million. Compared to the corresponding semester of 2008, this represents an increase of Rs. 774 million or (+4.6%) as shown in Table 1.9.

Exports of manufactured articles of apparel and clothing rose by Rs. 454 million during the first semester of 2009 compared to the corresponding period of last year. During the same period, an increase of Rs. 757 million in the exports of fish and fish preparations was registered compared to the corresponding semester of 2008, while exports of the product group "Textile yarn and fabrics" went down by Rs. 47 million. Other details of EOE exports by section are shown in Table 1.10.

The United Kingdom, France and the United States of America remain our principal EOE markets, accounting for Rs. 10,779 million or around 61% of total exports. Compared to the corresponding semester of 2008, exports to the United Kingdom decreased by Rs. 433 million (-7.1 %) and to France Rs. 275 million (-8.3%). Increases in exports of Rs. 477 million (+30.1%) to the United States of America were also noted. Exports to the Republic of South Africa went up by 71.4% from Rs. 602 million to Rs. 1032 million and that to the Malagasy Republic went down by 9.0% from Rs. 631 million to Rs. 574 million (Table 1.12).

EOE imports during the 1st semester of 2009 amounted to Rs. 8,006 million compared to Rs. 10,963 million for the corresponding period of 2008, representing a decrease of Rs. 2,957 million or 27.0% (Table1.13).

Imports of raw materials decreased by Rs. 2,695 million (-26.0%) from Rs. 10,352 million to Rs. 7,657 million and that of machinery and equipment decreased by Rs. 262 million (-42.9%) from Rs. 611 million to Rs. 349 million (Table 1.9).

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to Rs. 9,561 million and its ratio to total exports works out to around 54% compared to 35% during the corresponding semester of 2008 (Table 1.9).

It is to be noted that the above figures do not include transactions of the EOE with the Freeport. EOE sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales. It was valued at Rs. 904 million for the 1st semester of 2009 compared to Rs. 1,081 million for the corresponding period of 2008. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.
