#### SURVEY OF EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS IN LARGE ESTABLISHMENTS

March 2009 (Preliminary results)

#### 1. Introduction

The Central Statistics Office carries out, every year in March, the Survey of Employment and Earnings in 'large' establishments so as to obtain a continuous series of comparable data on the level of employment and earnings in these establishments. This issue of the Economic and Social Indicator presents the preliminary results for March 2009 and revised figures for 2007 and 2008.

It is to be noted that following the promulgation of the Finance Act 2006, no distinction is made between the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) and other manufacturing enterprises. This publication has been reviewed accordingly and figures are given for Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) instead of EPZ.

#### 2. Definition

## Large establishments include:

- (a) Agricultural establishments comprising:
  - (i) sugar cane plantations of 10 hectares or more;
  - (ii) tea plantations of 2 hectares or more;
  - (iii) all 'flue-cured' tobacco establishments, irrespective of acreage;
  - (iv) other agricultural establishments employing at least 10 persons on the day of the survey.
- (b) Non-agricultural establishments employing at least 10 persons on the day of the survey. It is to be noted that "outworkers", that is, piece rate workers who are working in their own homes on materials provided by the establishment, are excluded although they are remunerated by the establishment.
- (c) All central, regional and local government departments.

**Primary sector** comprises activities related to 'Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing' and 'Mining and quarrying'.

**Secondary sector** comprises activities related to 'Manufacturing', 'Electricity, gas and water supply' and 'Construction'.

Tertiary sector comprises all other activities which relate to the provision of services. These include 'Wholesale & retail trade, repair of m/vehicles, motor cycle, personal & household goods', 'Hotels and restaurants', 'Transport, storage & communication', 'Financial intermediation', 'Real estate, renting and business activities', 'Public administration & defence; compulsory social security', 'Education', 'Health and social work' and 'Other community, social and personal services'.

The **General Government** sector is made up of (i) Central Government (ii) Regional Government and (iii) Local Government as defined below.

(i.) **Central Government** covers all units that are agencies of the country's central authority. It consists of Budgetary Central Government and Extra Budgetary Units.

**Budgetary central Government** includes all ministries and departments.

*Extra Budgetary Units* are agencies operating under the authority of the Central Government and responsible for the performance of specialized governmental functions in such fields as health, education, social welfare, construction and so on.

- (ii.) **Regional Government** comprises the Regional Assembly of Rodrigues.
- (iii.) Local Government consists of municipalities and district councils/village councils.

## 3. Response

The preliminary results of the survey presented below are based on responses obtained from 56% of large establishments, representing 68% of total employment in this category of establishments. Estimates have been made for non-response on the basis of previous data and observed trend.

#### 4. Results

### 4.1 Employment Level, March 2008 – March 2009

Preliminary estimates show that total employment in large establishments covered by the survey was 297,844 in March 2009 compared to 307,510 in March 2008, representing a decrease of 9,666 (Table 1). The 'Manufacturing' sector registered the largest net decrease (10,744) followed by 'Hotels and restaurants' (1,725) and 'Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing' (989).

Employment in the primary sector went down from 18,846 in March 2008 to 17,857 in March 2009. Employment in the secondary sector decreased by 10,927 from 110,435 to 99,508 while the tertiary sector registered an increase of 2,250 from 178,229 to 180,479.

Analysis by sex shows that male employment decreased by 5,620 from 197,362 to 191,742 and female employment decreased by 4,046 from 110,148 to 106,102.

The total employment figure includes some 4,278 persons working in large establishments in Rodrigues, compared to 4,161 in March 2008 (Table 9). These were mainly government employees of Rodrigues Regional Assembly numbering 2,719 in March 2009.

Foreign workers are also included in the total employment figure and their number stood at 19,707 (12,119 males and 7,588 females) in March 2009 (Table 8). These workers were mainly engaged in the 'Manufacturing' sector. Compared to March 2008, there was a decrease of 3,157 in the number of foreign workers.

#### 4.2 Employment by Industry

Between March 2008 and March 2009, the industry groups 'Manufacturing', 'Hotels and restaurants' and 'Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing', registered losses of 10,744, 1,725 and 989 jobs respectively while employment grew in almost all other major industry groups. The main groups registering increases in employment were 'Real estate, renting and business activities' (1,820), 'Wholesale & retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods' (961), 'Financial intermediation' (547) and 'Education' (519).

#### 4.3 Employment by sex

As regards distribution by sex, male employment showed a decrease of 5,620. Within industry groups, it is observed that 'Manufacturing' registered a decrease of 4,134 in male employment followed by 'Hotels and restaurants' (1,387), and 'Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing' (945). On the other hand, increases were noted mainly in 'Real estate, renting business activities (884) and 'Wholesale & retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods' (456).

Female employment decreased by 4,046. The main contributors to this decrease were 'Manufacturing' (6,610) and 'Hotels and restaurants' (338). Female employment increased in 'Real estate, renting and business activities' by 936 and in 'Wholesale & retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods' (505) and 'Education' (466).

The evolution of employment in large establishments by sex and industrial group since 2007 is shown in Table 2.

### 4.4 Employment in the General Government Sector

Employment in the General Government Sector decreased by 518 from 73,386 in March 2008 to 72,868 in March 2009 (Table 3). Male employment decreased by 1,179 from 50,220 to 49,041 while female employment increased by 661 from 23,166 to 23,827.

Analysis by industrial group showed an increase in employment in 'Education' (263) and decreases of 226, 251 and 192 in 'Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing', 'Public administration and defence; compulsory social security' and 'Health and social work' respectively.

## 4.5 Employment in the large establishments of the EOE sector

The number of persons employed by 'large' EOE establishments decreased by 9,755 from 66,782 (48,371 Mauritians and 18,411 foreigners) in March 2008 to 57,027 (40,190 Mauritians and 16,837 foreigners) in March 2009 (Table 4). Decreases were mainly noted in 'Wearing apparel (except footwear)' (8,199), 'Textiles' (1,315) and 'Jewellery and related articles' (257), while increase was mainly observed in 'Food' (212).

The number of male employees decreased by 3,304 to stand at 23,833 in March 2009. Female employment stood at 33,194, a decrease of 6,451 from March 2008 to March 2009.

#### 4.6 Earnings

The level of average earnings is influenced mainly by increases in basic salaries and wages. However, fluctuations may also occur because of:

- (a) Changes in the mix of employees of various categories or with various lengths of service. For example, a large intake of professionals by, say, an architectural firm can cause a sudden jump in the average monthly earnings. On the other hand, a large intake of employees at the lower end of a wage scale has the effect of lowering the average earnings.
- (b) Changes in overtime, regular bonuses and commissions.

#### 4.6.1 Earnings in all large establishments

For the purpose of the survey, employees are classified into the following different categories according to type of pay: monthly, daily, piece and hourly rate. Table 6 presents the average earnings by industry group for the years 2007 - 2009, where all rates have been converted to a monthly basis.

'Financial intermediation' registered the highest average earnings (Rs 28,768) followed by 'Electricity, gas and water supply' (Rs 24,945) while the lowest average monthly earnings (Rs 6,870) was noted in 'Mining and quarrying'.

Overall average monthly earnings in large establishments increased by about 16.7% from Rs 14,438 in March 2008 to Rs 16,849 in March 2009. A general upward trend was observed in all industry groups. Highest increases were registered in 'Public administration and defence; compulsory social security' (30.8%), 'Education' (29.3%) and 'Health and social work (19.7%) and are mainly due to salary revision in the public sector (PRB report). A significant increase of 16.3% is also noted in 'Hotels and restaurants'.

4.6.2 Earnings in large establishments of the EOE sector

Earnings in the EOE sector have also been converted to monthly rate (Table 7). The

average monthly earnings in this sector increased by 10.5% from Rs 7,881 in March 2008 to

Rs 8,708 in March 2009. At March 2009, the average monthly earnings in manufacturing

establishments of the EOE sector was Rs 8,461 compared to Rs 17,502 in non-manufacturing

establishments. The corresponding figures for 2008 were Rs 7,689 and Rs 16,360

respectively.
