

## External Trade – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2011

### 1. Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents external trade statistics for the first and second quarters of 2011 and for the years 2009 and 2010. These statistics are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are at times revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) - Customs Department.

Thus while figures for 2009 published in this indicator are final, those for 2010 are subject to revision as and when the MRA - Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Central Statistics Office.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for. However, it was not possible prior to 2002 to include Freeport transactions in our general trade statistics because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority. Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it possible to integrate data of the Freeport zone with those of Customs.

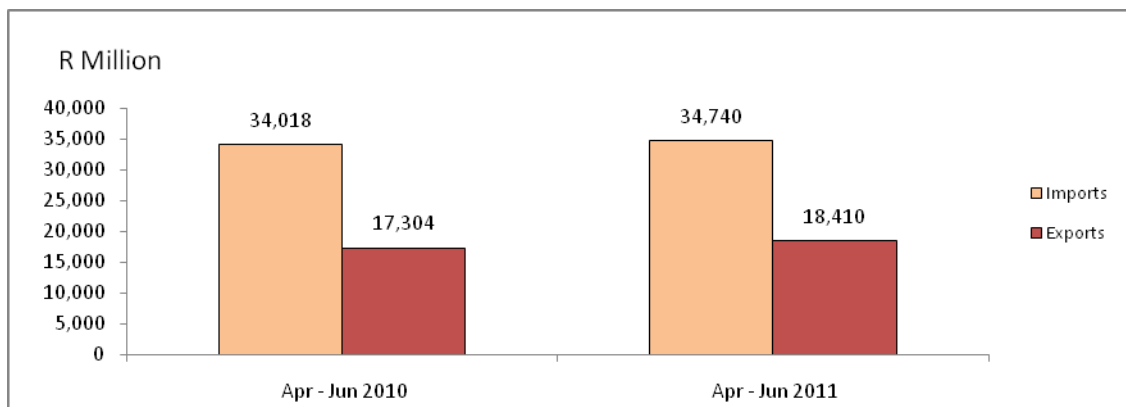
Hence, as from 2002, data on imports and exports include transactions through the Mauritius Freeport. It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius because it is not possible to distinguish between domestic exports and re-exports of freeport licensees. It is estimated that for the second quarter of 2011 some 27% of freeport exports were sourced locally.

### 2. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the second quarter of 2011 was valued at R 53,150 million, i.e. 1.2% higher than the previous quarter and 3.6% higher than the corresponding quarter of 2010.

During the second quarter of 2011, total exports were valued at R 18,410 million against imports of R 34,740 million. This resulted in a trade deficit of R 16,330 million, compared to deficits of R 16,947 million (-3.6%) for the previous quarter and R 16,714 million (-2.3%) for the corresponding quarter of 2010.

### 3. Exports

#### 3.1 Total exports (Table 1)

Total export proceeds for the second quarter of 2011, including domestic exports<sup>1</sup>, re-exports<sup>2</sup> and ships' stores and bunkers, amounted to R 18,410 million, showing increases of 3.6% over the previous quarter and 6.4% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2010.

Domestic exports, which accounted for 74.2% of total exports, went up by 7.3% from R 12,737 million in the previous quarter to R 13,669 million in the second quarter of 2011. Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2010, domestic exports were higher by 4.5%. In the second quarter of 2011 re-exports stood at R 2,388 million, i.e. lower by 12.1% and 6.7% compared to the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2010 respectively.

Total exports for the first semester of 2011 were R 36,188 million, showing an increase of 15.0% over the first semester of 2010.

#### 3.2 Exports by SITC section - (First semester 2011)

Exports of "Food and live animals" for the first semester of 2011 amounted to Rs 9,668 million, showing an increase of 12.0% over the first semester of 2010. Exports of sugar went up by 40.6% while those for "fish and fish preparations" declined by 2.0%. (Table 3).

For the first semester of 2011, exports of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" were valued at R 3,406 million, higher by 22.3% compared to exports of R 2,785 million for the first six months of 2010.

Total exports of "Machinery and transport equipment" for the first semester of 2011 decreased by 3.1% from R 809 million in the first semester of 2010 to R 784 million in the first semester of 2011.

Export proceeds for the first semester of 2011 from "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" increased by 10.5% compared to the corresponding period of 2010, to reach R 15,483 million from R 14,014 million. These articles represented 49.1% of total exports during the first semester of 2011. Exports of "Articles of apparel & clothing accessories", representing 83.1% of exports of this section showed an increase of 14.8% compared to the first semester of 2010.

#### 3.3 Exports of Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) - (First semester 2011)

During the first semester of 2011, exports of EOE amounted to R 20,940 million showing an increase of 12.1% compared to the corresponding period of 2010 (Table 1). Details on exports of these enterprises will be presented in the Economic and Social Indicators on the Export Oriented Enterprises, which will be released on 22 September 2011.

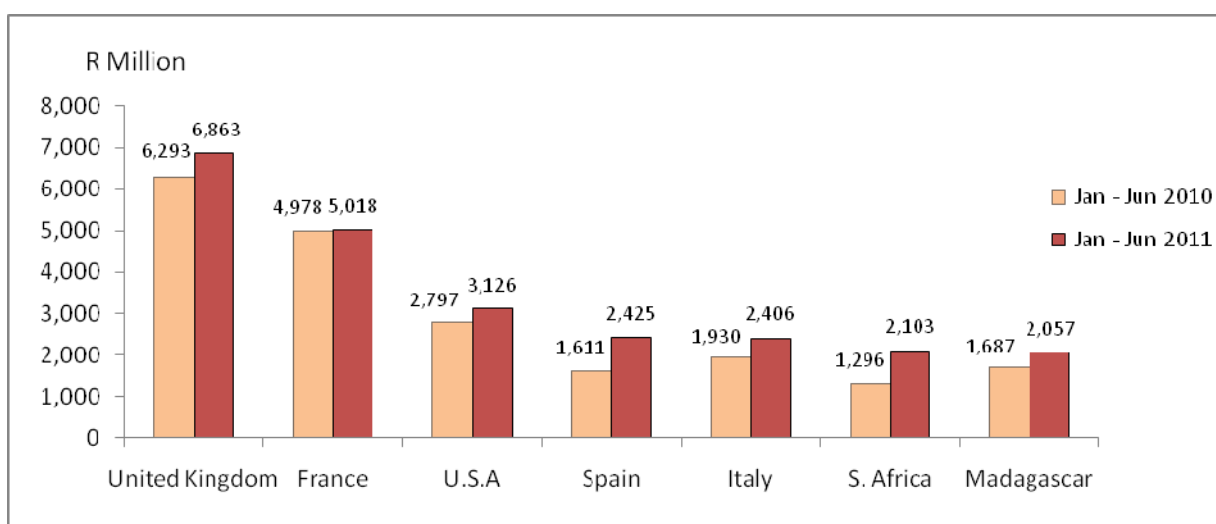
<sup>2</sup> Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

### 3.4 Exports by country of destination - (First semester 2011)

Analysis of export figures by country of destination for the first semester of 2011 shows that the European countries were our main buyers, purchasing some 64.5% of our exports for a value of R 20,340 million. The United Kingdom remained our main market with R 6,863 million, or 21.8% of total exports. The other major destinations for our exports were France (15.9%), U.S.A (9.9%), Spain (7.7%), Italy (7.6%), South Africa (6.7%) and Madagascar (6.5%) respectively (Table 7).

Compared to the first six months of 2010, total exports to South Africa and Spain went up by 62.3% and 50.5% respectively while exports to Italy, Madagascar, USA and UK rose by 24.7%, 21.9%, 11.8% and 9.1% respectively.

## 4. Imports

### 4.1 Total imports - (Table 1)

Total imports for the second quarter of 2011 reached R 34,740 million, remaining almost the same compared to the previous quarter but increased by 2.1% over the corresponding quarter of 2010.

Total imports for the first semester of 2011 amounted to R 69,465 million, representing an increase of 10.6% over the corresponding semester of 2010.

### 4.2 Imports by SITC section - (First semester 2011)

Imports of “*Food and live animals*” for the first semester of 2011 were valued at R 12,302 million, higher by 8.1% compared to the corresponding period of last year. Imports of fish and fish preparations and wheat registered increases of 22.5% and 17.6% respectively. On the other hand, decreases were noted in imports of meat and meat preparations (- 15.1%) and dairy products (- 3.0%) (Table 10).

The import bill of “*Mineral fuels, lubricants, & related products*” stood at R 16,763 million representing an increase of 35.8% over the corresponding semester of last year.

Imports of “*Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*” for the first semester rose by 15.6% to reach R 13,245 million. The main increases being in “Textile yarn” (+ 59.6%), “Manufactures of metal” (+ 40.1%) and “Cotton fabrics” (+ 13.2%).

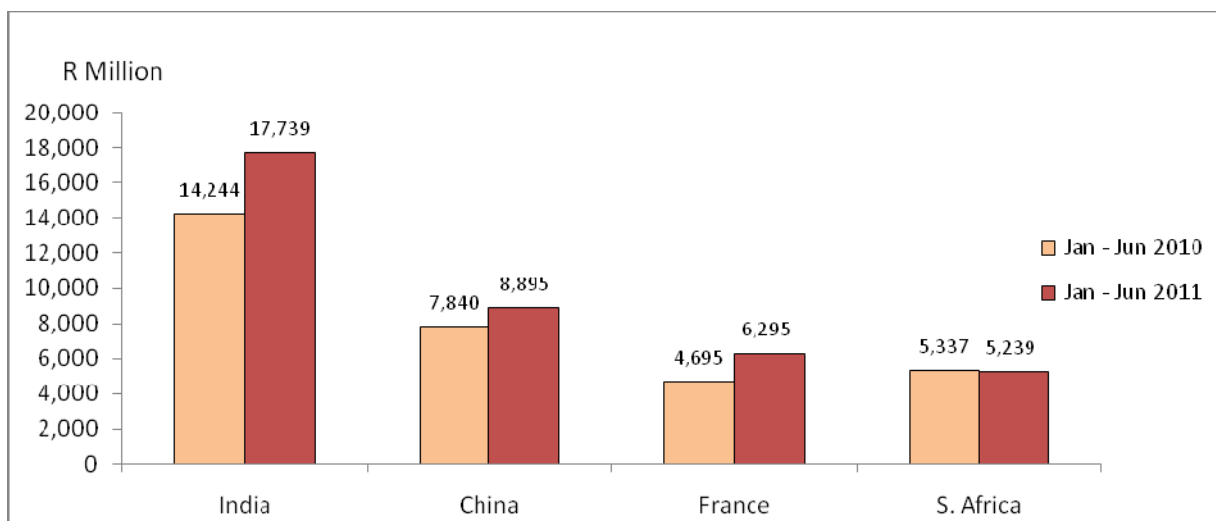
For the first semester of 2011, imports of “*Machinery & transport equipment*” which were valued at R 11,615 million fell by 12.8%, compared to the same period of last year.

#### 4.3 Imports by country of origin – (First semester 2011)

During the first semester of 2011, imports from the Asian continent, our major supplier, amounted to R 37,330 million, representing 53.7% of total imports.

Our imports originated mainly from the following countries: India (25.5%), China (12.8%), France (9.1%) and South Africa (7.5%). The high share of India in our import bill is explained by the fact that India is our main supplier of petroleum products (Table 13).

#### 5. Trade with Regional Organisations – (First semester 2011)

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States during the first semester of 2011 stood at R 5,102 million, against imports of R 7,225 million (Table 14). The trade deficit with ACP countries worked out to Rs 2,123 million.

During the first semester of 2011, our exports to COMESA countries attained R 2,853 million while imports from these countries amounted to R 1,811 million resulting in a favourable trade balance of R 1,042 million for Mauritius. Madagascar was the main buyer with a share of 72.1%. Our main suppliers were Kenya (36.4%) and Egypt (22.9%) (Table 15).

Trade with SADC countries for the first semester of 2011 showed a deficit of R 1,422 million, resulting from imports of a value of R 6,116 million and exports worth R 4,694 million. The main supplier was South Africa (85.7%) and our main buyers were South Africa (44.8%) and Madagascar (43.8%) (Table 16).

## **6. Trade in Freeport Zone - (First semester 2011)**

During the first semester of 2011, total imports of the Freeport Zone stood at R 3,838 million, higher by 47.6% compared to the corresponding period of last year. The main items imported through the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations”, “Beverages and tobacco” and “Chemicals and related products & accessories” (Table 12).

Re-exports to overseas markets valued at R 3,035 million, decreased by 14.7% when compared to the first semester of 2010. The main items re-exported by the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations” and “Chemicals and related products, n.e.s” (Table 6).

## **7. Forecast 2011**

Based on data for the first semester of 2011 and past trends, total exports for the year 2011 are expected to be of the order of R 76,000 million, against R 155,000 million for imports. The trade deficit would be around R 79,000 million.

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## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS2007). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 4) or SITC Rev. 4. The HS and the SITC Rev. 4 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.
