### INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL & TOURISM

# **January to September 2012**

### Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents data on International Travel and Tourism and hotel statistics for the period January to September of 2012. A brief on the compilation of these statistics is given at Annex I while Annex II contains a glossary of terms used.

# 2. Passenger Traffic

### 2.1 Total Passenger Traffic

Passenger traffic for the first nine months of 2012 totalled 1,862,088, made up of 914,399 arrivals and 947,689 departures. Compared to the same period of 2011, arrivals decreased marginally by 0.5% while departures remained almost unchanged (Table 1). Total passenger arrivals included 883,772 (96.7%) by air and 30,627 (3.3%) by sea, while total passenger departures consisted of 913,947 (96.4%) by air and 33,742 (3.6%) by sea. Total passenger arrivals by sea included 21,800 "cruise travellers" (around 8,200 tourists, 6,000 excursionists, 30 Mauritian residents and 7,570 crews) aboard 17 cruise ships, which visited our port during the first nine months of 2012.


### 2.2 Excursionists (Same day visitors)

Total excursionists, i.e. visitors arriving and leaving on the same day, numbered 14,869, of which 8,790 (59.1%) arrived by air and 6,079 (40.9%) by sea. Excursionists arriving by air included 2,840 (32.3%) from Reunion Island and 1,889 (21.5%) from France. Excursionists by sea were mainly from: United Kingdom (1,546 or 25.4%), Republic of South Africa (1,096 or 18.0%) and United States of America (951 or 15.6%).

#### 2.3 Mauritian Residents


Figure 1 - Percentage distribution of Mauritian departures by major country of disembarkation, January - September of 2011 and 2012

During the period under review, the number of Mauritian residents travelling abroad increased by 8.3% to 175,566 compared to 162,058 for the first nine months of 2011 and accounted for 18.5% of total departures (Table 2). The main countries of disembarkation, which may not necessarily be the country of final destination when the passengers are in transit, were: France (28,183 or 16.1%), Reunion (26,278 or 15.0%), United Arab Emirates (25,050 or 14.3%), United Kingdom (18,071 or 10.3%), India (17,776 or 10.1%) and Republic of South Africa (16,091 or 9.2%) (Figure 1).

# 2.4 Tourist Arrivals

Tourist arrivals for the first nine months of 2012 increased by 0.2% to reach 675,584 compared to 674,383 in the corresponding period of 2011. Figure 2 shows monthly tourist arrivals for the period January to September of 2011 and 2012. Further details on tourist arrivals are given in Tables 3 to 6.

Around 92% of the tourists came for holidays while 4.7% were on business/conference trips and another 2.6% were in transit (Table 4).

Tourist arrivals from Europe, which accounts for nearly 58% of total tourist arrivals, decreased by 7.7% from 421,060 in the first nine months of 2011 to 388,649 in the corresponding period of 2012. Arrivals from France, the leading European market, decreased by 11.9% to 179,328. Other major tourist generating countries of Europe also registered decreases as follows: Germany (-2.4%), United Kingdom (-3.8%) and Italy (-25.6%). As regards the remaining European countries, the following changes were noted: Russian Federation (+91.2%), Spain (+0.6%), Switzerland (+10.6%), Belgium (-7.4%), Austria (-9.8%), Sweden (-11.5%) and Netherlands (-18.9%).

During the first nine months of 2012, tourist arrivals from Africa, with a share of around 27% of total tourist arrivals, rose by 13.2% to 184,485. Arrivals from Reunion Island, the main market of the region, increased by 19.2% to 96,567 and those from Republic of South Africa, the second important regional market, were up by 2.9% to 61,252. The following changes were registered from the other African countries: Kenya (+43.5%), Malagasy Republic (+19.9%), Zimbabwe (+10.0%), Comoros (+0.1%) and Seychelles (-16.4%).

Tourist arrivals from the Asian market, which represented 11% of total tourist arrivals, went up by 14.1% from 66,950 for the first nine months of 2011 to 76,378 for the same period of 2012. Arrivals from India, the major source on this continent, increased by 0.7% to 40,474 and those from People's Republic of China, the other emerging market of this region increased by 38.3% to 15,430. The other Asian countries registered the following changes: Hong Kong (+110.7%), United Arab Emirates (+44.6%), Japan (+13.0%), Malaysia (+1.0%) and Singapore (-15.2%).

Tourist arrivals from Oceania rose by 11.7% from 12,105 to 13,521 driven by an increase in arrivals of 13.5% from Australia, which was slightly offset by a decrease of 15.4% from the other Oceanian countries.

Tourist arrivals from the continent of America went up by 18.5% with changes as follows: Canada (+18.0%), USA (-0.4%) and "Other American" countries (+55.3%).




Figure 3 - Tourist Arrivals from Top Ten Markets, January - September of 2011 and 2012

Tourist arrivals from top ten markets for the period January to September of 2011 and 2012 are given in Figure 3.

### 3. Tourist Nights

The total number of tourist nights spent in the country during the first nine months of 2012 is estimated at 7,260 thousand, which is at the same level as that of the corresponding period of 2011 (Table 6).

### 4. Hotel Statistics

At the end of September 2012, there was a total of 108 registered hotels of which 105 were in operation and three hotels were not operating due to renovation works. The total room capacity of the registered hotels in operation was 11,715 with 23,899 bedplaces (Table 7). For the first nine months of 2012, the room occupancy rate for all hotels averaged 60% compared to 63% in the corresponding period of 2011 while the bed occupancy rate was 53% against 55% for the first nine months of 2011 (Table 8).

"Large" hotels, i.e. well-established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms, numbered 47 (45% of all registered hotels in operation). These hotels had a combined room capacity of 8,613 with 17,695 bedplaces, representing 74% of both total room capacity and total bedplaces respectively. The average room occupancy rate for these hotels for the first nine months of 2012 was 62% (63% in 2011) and bed occupancy rate averaged 55%, same as in the corresponding period of 2011 (Table 8).

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**5. Gross Tourism Receipts** 

Data from the Bank of Mauritius indicate that gross tourism receipts for the first nine months

of 2012 were Rs 31,954 million, i.e. an increase of 6.0% compared to Rs 30,149 million for the same

period of 2011 (Table 6).

6. Employment

According to the Survey of Employment and Earnings, direct employment in hotels,

restaurants and travel and tourism establishments employing 10 persons or more stood at 28,187 at the

end of March 2012, showing an increase of 0.2% over the figure of 28,133 for March 2011. Of this

number, 21,787 or 77.3% were engaged in hotels (Table 9).

7. Forecast Years 2012 and 2013

Based on data available on tourist arrivals and information gathered from the main

stakeholders, tourist arrivals for the year 2012 is expected to reach 965,000, which is at the same level

to the figure of 964,642 in 2011. The forecasted number of tourists for 2013 is 1,000,000.

According to the Bank of Mauritius, tourism receipts for the year 2012 will be around

Rs 43,500 million (+1.8 %) compared to Rs 42,717 million in 2011. For year 2013, tourism receipts

are forecasted at around Rs 47,000 million.

#### BRIEF ON COMPILATION OF PASSENGER TRAFFIC STATISTICS

#### Sources of data

The main source of data for the compilation of passenger traffic statistics is the Passport and Immigration Office, which maintains a database of all travellers entering and leaving the country. The data are collected from the passport of travellers, disembarkation cards filled in by non-residents and questions put to non-residents entering the country. At the end of every month, passenger traffic for that particular month is downloaded and supplied to the statistics unit of the Ministry of Tourism and Leisure within fifteen days. Additional data on cruises are supplied by the Mauritius Ports Authority.

To supplement the recurrent statistics a Survey of Outgoing Tourists (SOT) is conducted every two years since 1984 jointly by the Central Statistics Office and the Ministry of Tourism and Leisure. This survey covers a representative sample of tourists at departure and provides qualitative and quantitative information on tourists. Results of the survey are published in the Survey of Outgoing Tourists report.

#### **Tourism receipts**

The Bank of Mauritius is responsible for the estimation of tourism receipts based on monthly statements of Inward and Outward Remittances of Commercial Banks.

### **Monthly Occupancy Rates**

All hotels are contacted by phone at the end of every month for data on room/bed nights available and rented during the month for the calculation of room and bed occupancy rates.

### Short-term projections of tourist arrivals

A Tourism Statistics Committee grouping various stakeholders of the tourism industry meet regularly under the chairmanship of the Director of the Central Statistics Office to discuss performance of the tourism sector and to provide information for short-term forecast of tourist arrivals.

#### 1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying overnight but less than a year, and who has no employer-employee relationship with a resident.

### 2. Transit

A transit passenger is one who stops over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

Type I: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the harbour.

*Type II*: Passengers who do leave the airport or harbour and stay in the country overnight but only for flight connection purposes.

Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

# 3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

Excursionists are non-resident visitors, other than those who do not leave the airport, who depart on the same day they arrived.

### 4. Tourist Nights

"Tourist nights" means the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists, as defined above, during the period under review.

#### 5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

### 6. Occupancy rate

The room/bed occupancy rate is the ratio of room/bed nights rented to the total number of room/bed nights available.

= <u>Total number of room/bed nights rented</u> x 100 Total number of room/bed nights available

#### **7. CIS**

**CIS** denotes the Commonwealth of Independent States. It consists of the States of the former Soviet Union.
